Ministers Address Boys on Thanksgiving Theme

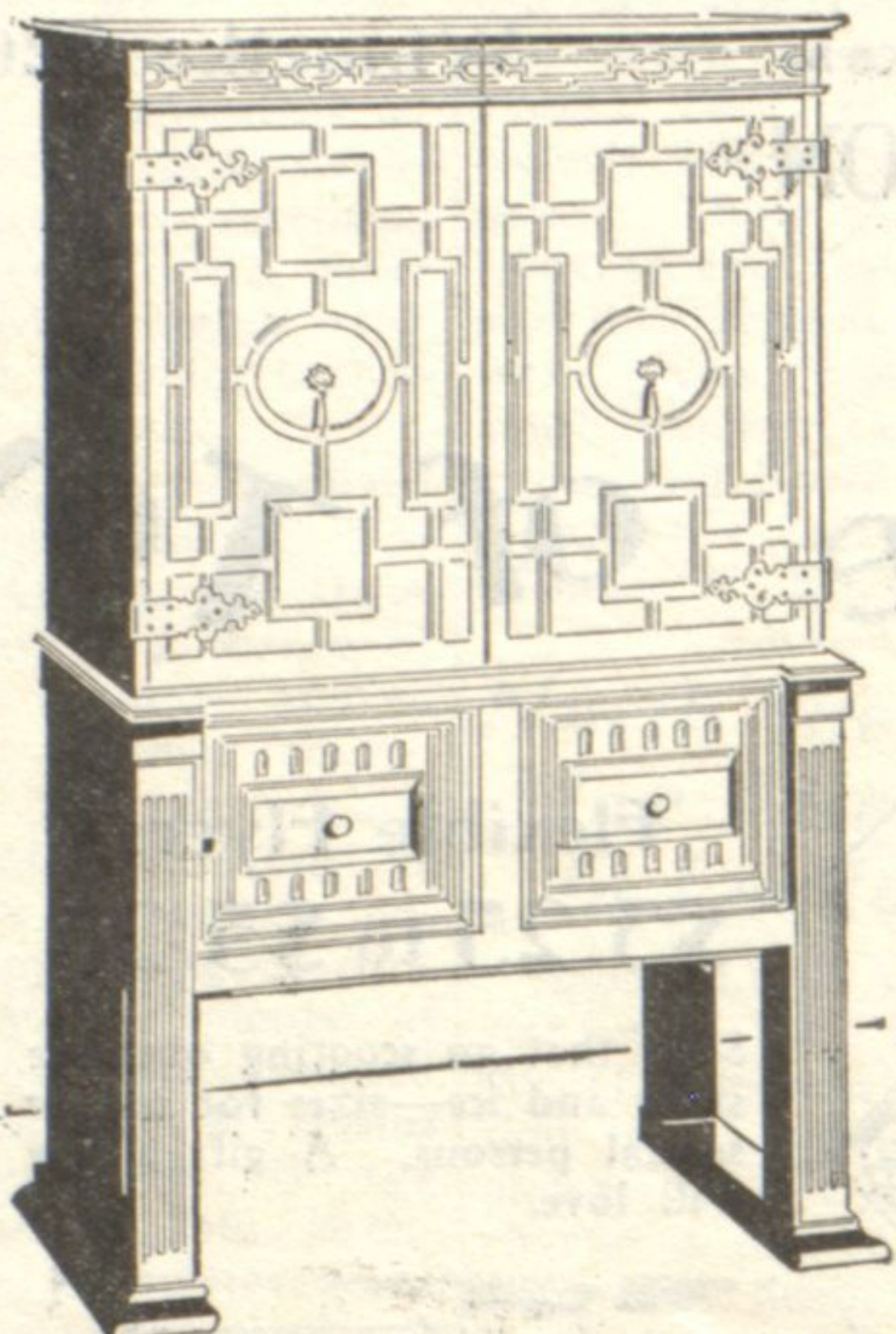

Both Mrs. Laimbeer and her daughter, Miss Natalie, a New York debutante of this season, are socially prominent in New York.



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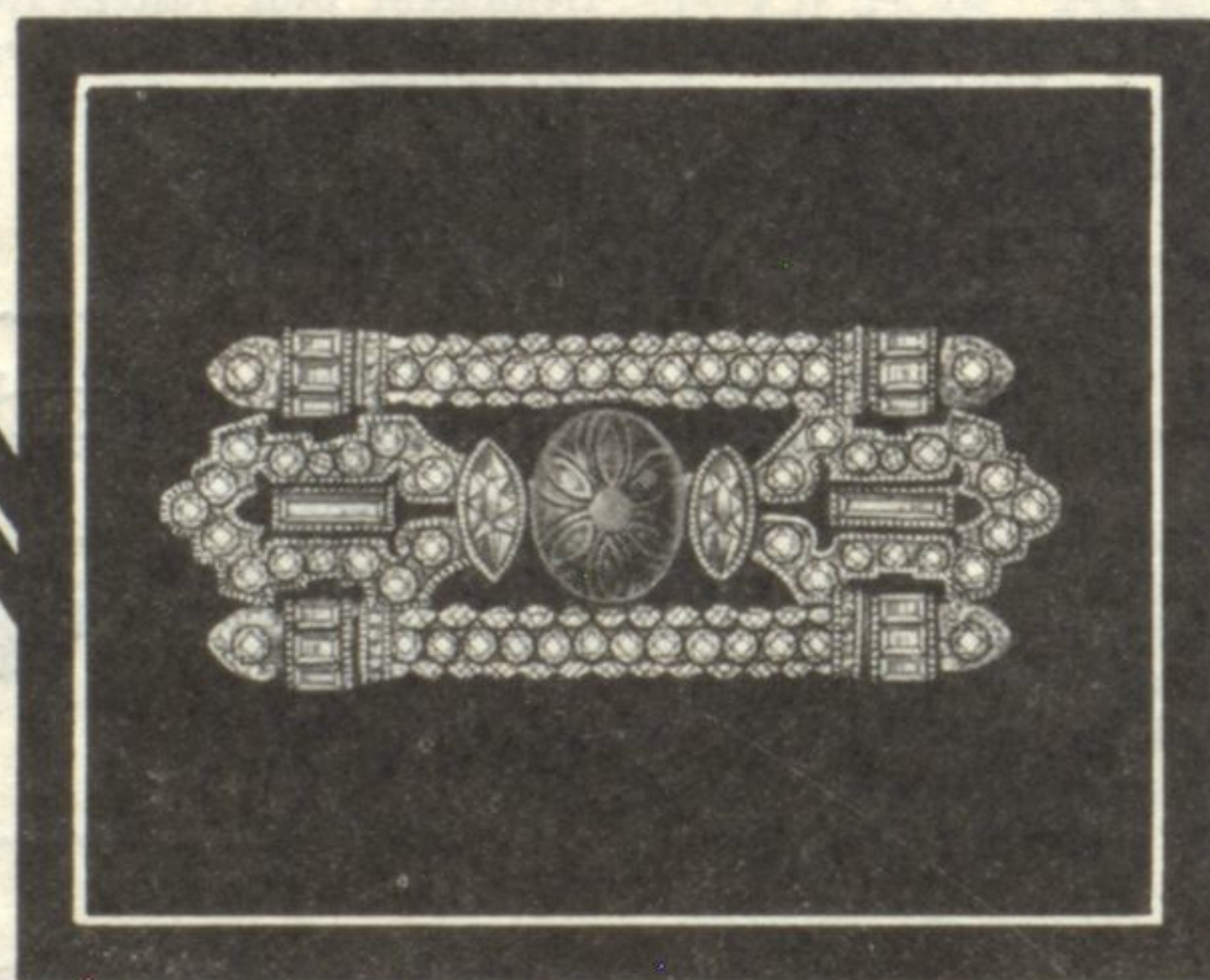


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
