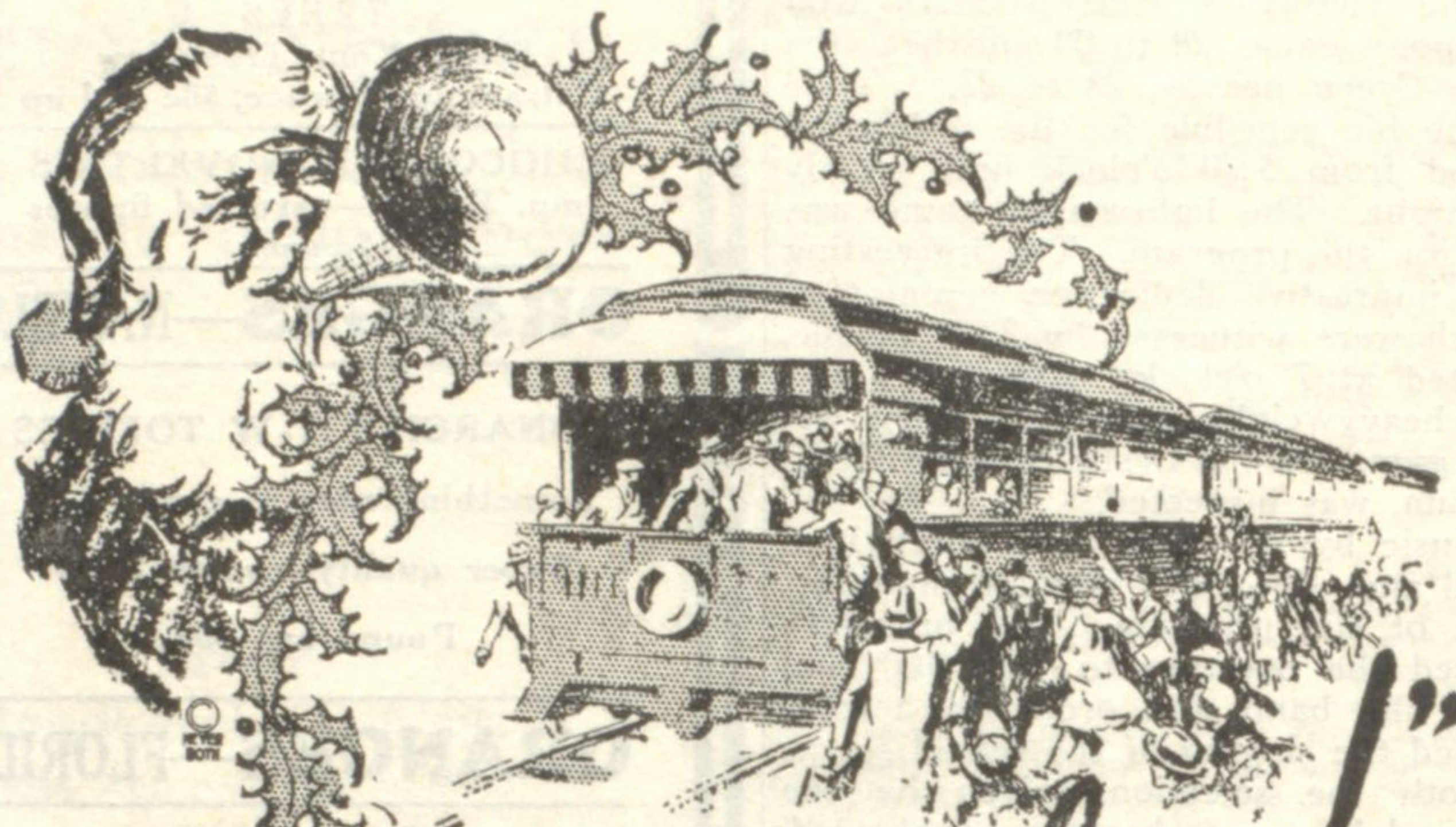
SINGS AT GREAT LAKES
