The Sunday evening concerts at the Orrington are complimentary to guests of the hotel and their friends and are arranged by its management.

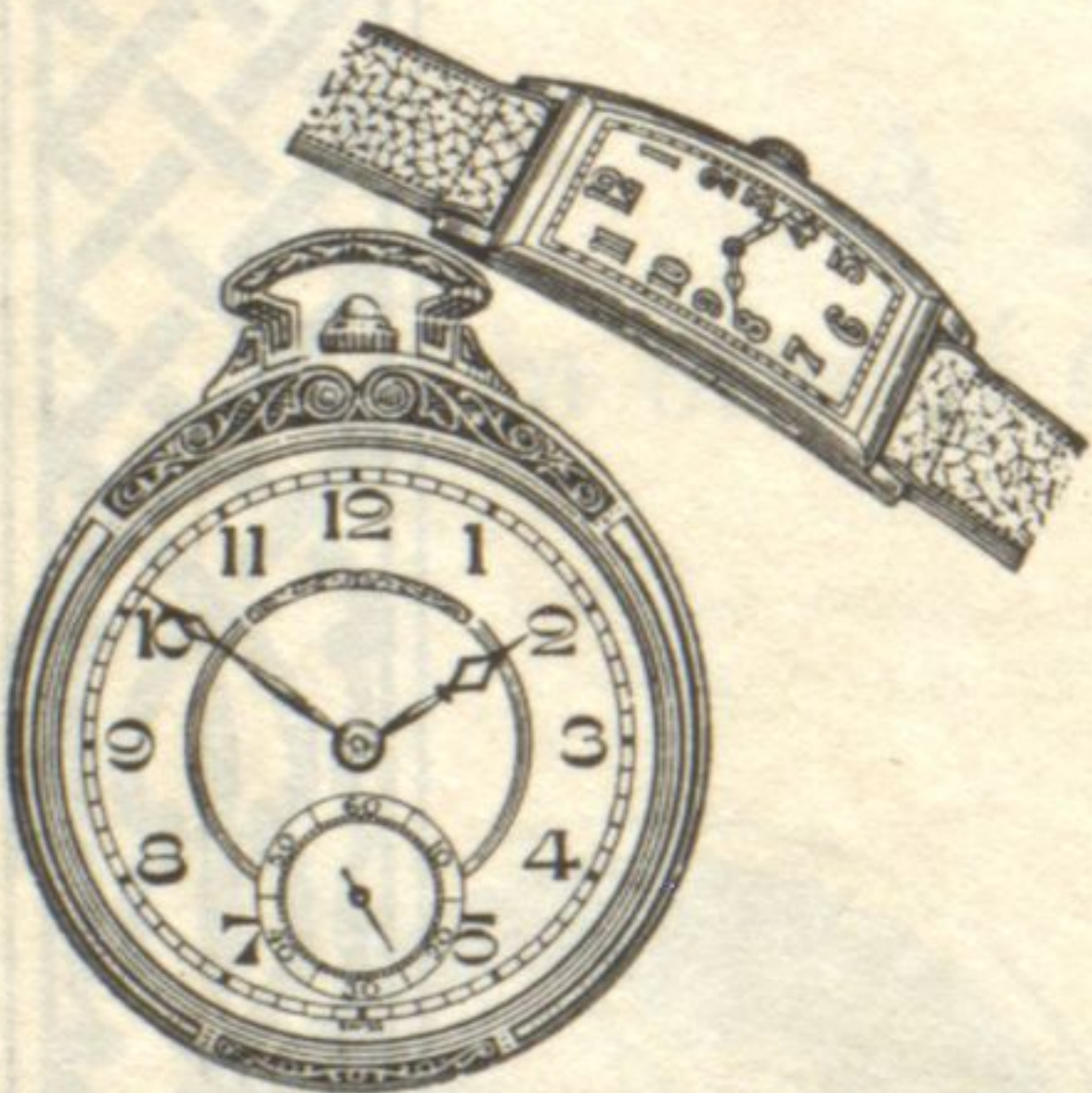

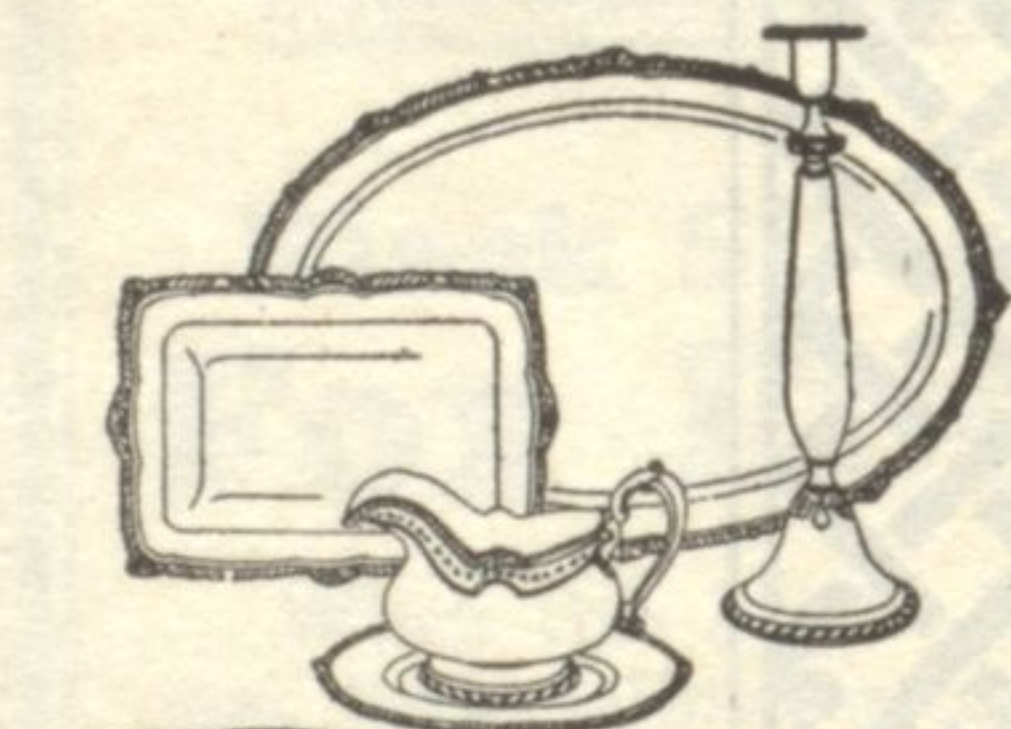
