HOLD NATIONAL MEET

N. U. Chapter of Tau Delta Phi Sponsors Convention

Sponsored by Northwestern university and the University of Chicago undergraduate chapters and local alumni, the eighteenth annual convention of Tau Delta Phi, national college fraternity, will be held at the Congress hotel. Two hundred delegates of the active chapters will be here for the day conclave, which begins Saturday.

The convention, the first to be held in the middlewest since it was last in Chicago in 1925, will be opened with a business session Saturday morning and will continue with fraternal conferences in the daytime and social festivities in the evenings until Monday night, when a formal New Year's eve ball will be held.
