Special departments are to be provided for furniture sales, upholstery, refinishing and repairing, thus keeping the employes busy throughout the year.

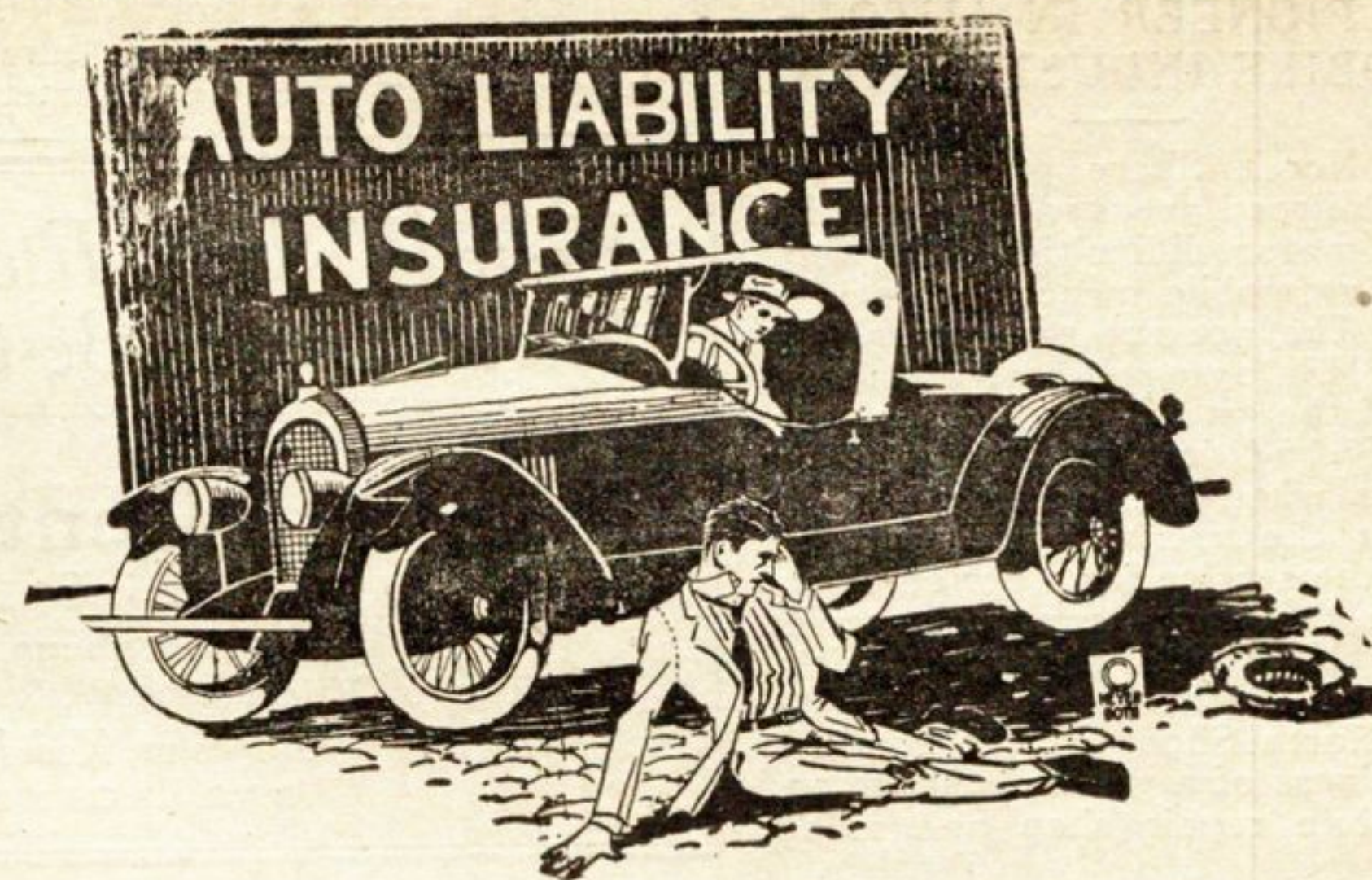

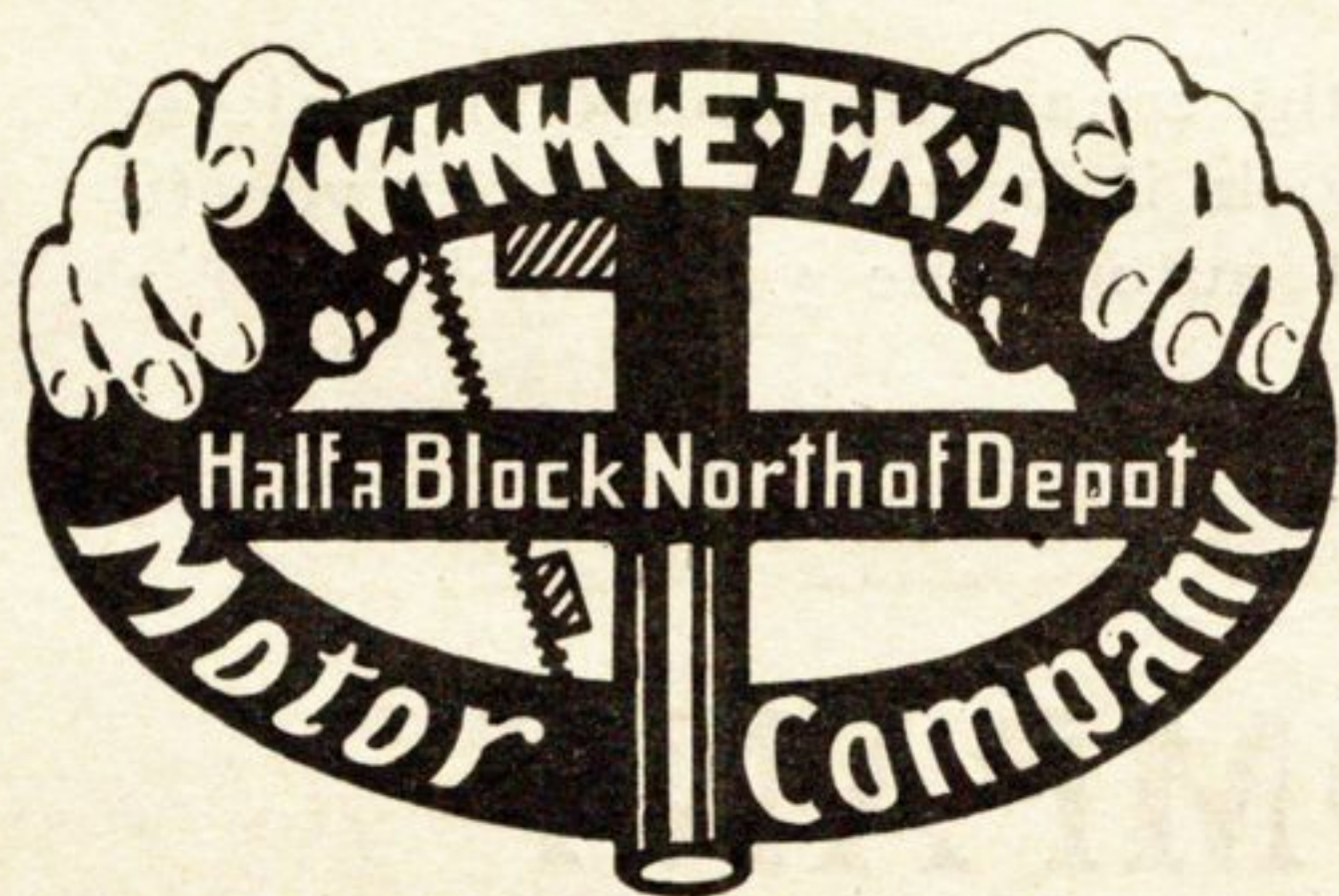
