nurses. Two Courses Offered

The Evanston hospital training school offers two courses of training to its student nurses. The diploma course occupies a period of three years; the degree and diploma course five years. (This applies to girls who have completed a four-year high school course.) College graduates will receive credit for their work, depending upon the line of study they have pursued.

The states are represented in the registrations so far for September, according to Miss McCleery. Over half of these have had at least one year of college, and seven of the total number are candidates for the degrees.


