BERLIN, Nov. 19.—The parting between the Emperor and his mother was very touching. He kissed and embraced her many times. The party met the Prince of Wales at Flushing and embarked on the royal yacht which started for England near midnight.

LONDON, Nov. 19.—Most of the English papers, in referring to the visit of the ex-Empress of Germany, express warm sympathy and welcome.

LONDON, Nov. 18.—The Royal yacht bearing the Empress Frederick, of Germany, and her daughter, and the Prince of Wales, reached Port Victoria this morning. Queen Victoria and the Princess Louise, and Beatrice left Windsor this morning to greet the Empress on landing.
