The Bertillon system for the identification of criminals has received a practical illustration before the Prison Commission of New York State, which has been recommended for general adoption. The system, which consists of a series of accurate and minute measurements of the human body, is based upon the proven idea that no two bodies are alike. A bill will soon be introduced in the State Legislature authorizing the various cities to utilize the Bertillon system. This bill will further provide for the establishment of a Bureau of Criminal Identification in the various police departments, and will apply if they adopt the system of measurements. An effort will be made also to interest Congress in the matter, to the end that a national bureau for the Bertillon system may be established at some central point.
