

### Germans at Wood.

German scientists who have investigated the wood of trees for use as human food to eke out the supply of ordinary breadstuffs report that wood contains large quantities of sugar, starch, and oil, and small quantities of albumen, particularly in the winter months. The food elements are found principally in the twigs and sapwood of the tree. The hardwoods contain the most starch, while the soft woods contain little starch but also considerable oil. Pine and spruce contain too much resin to be used as food, while oak and willow contain too much tannin. The wood must be finely ground and mixed with the digestive organs can utilize it.


