

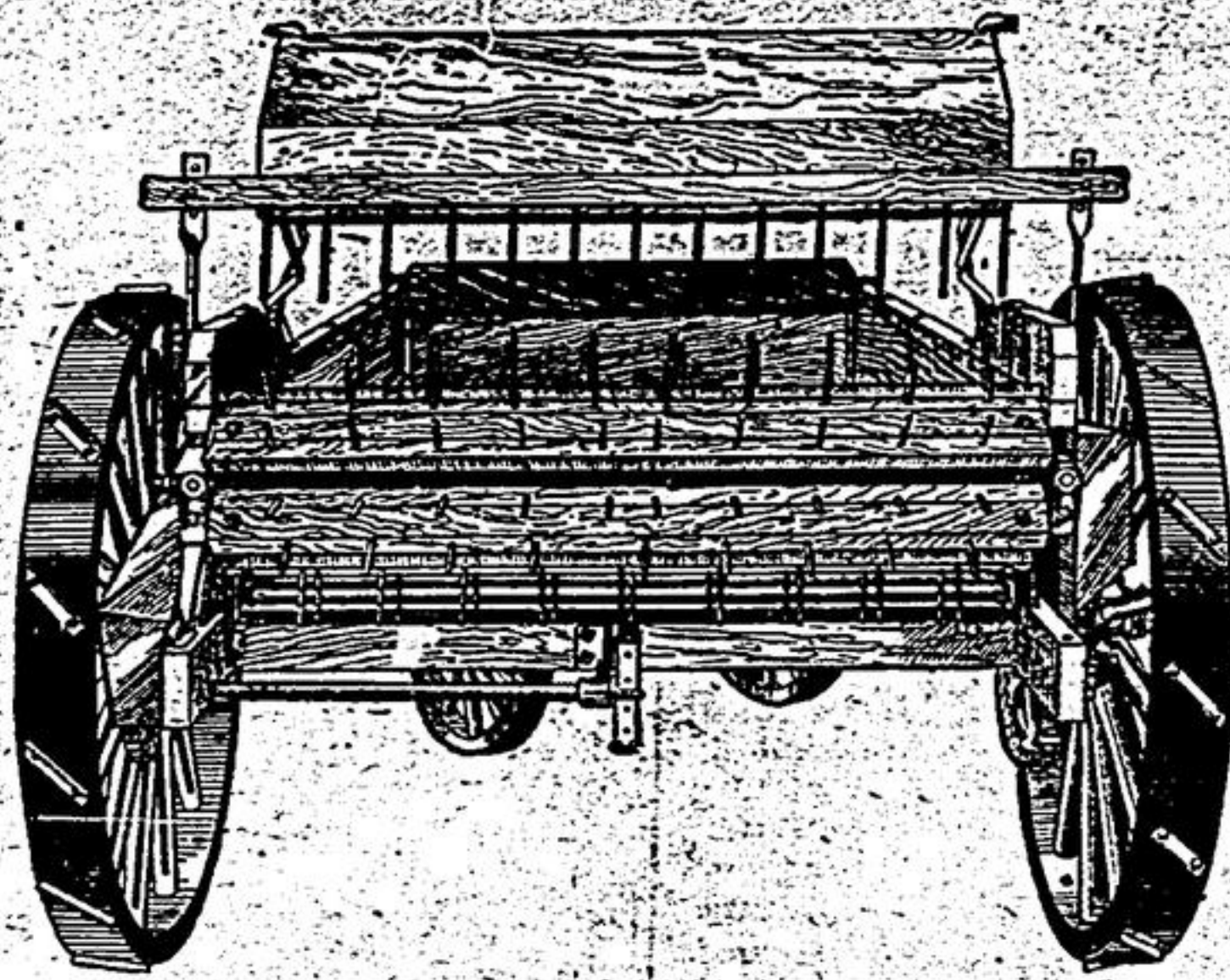

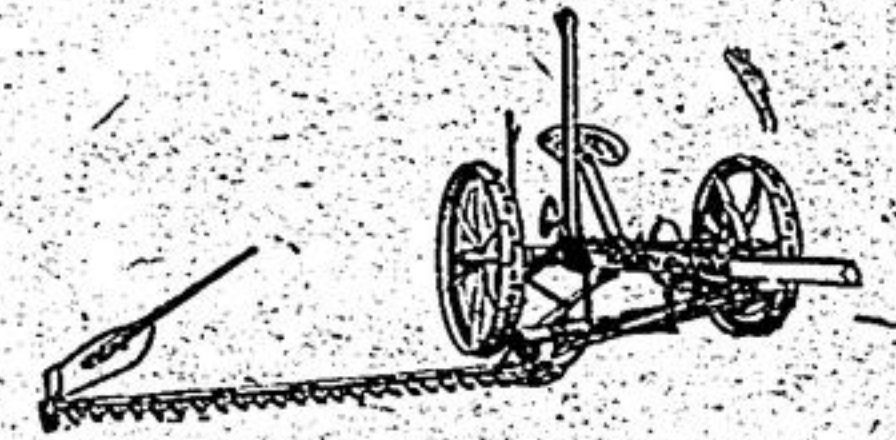

The new No. 21-20 Massey-Harris 5 ft. Mower is a dandy.

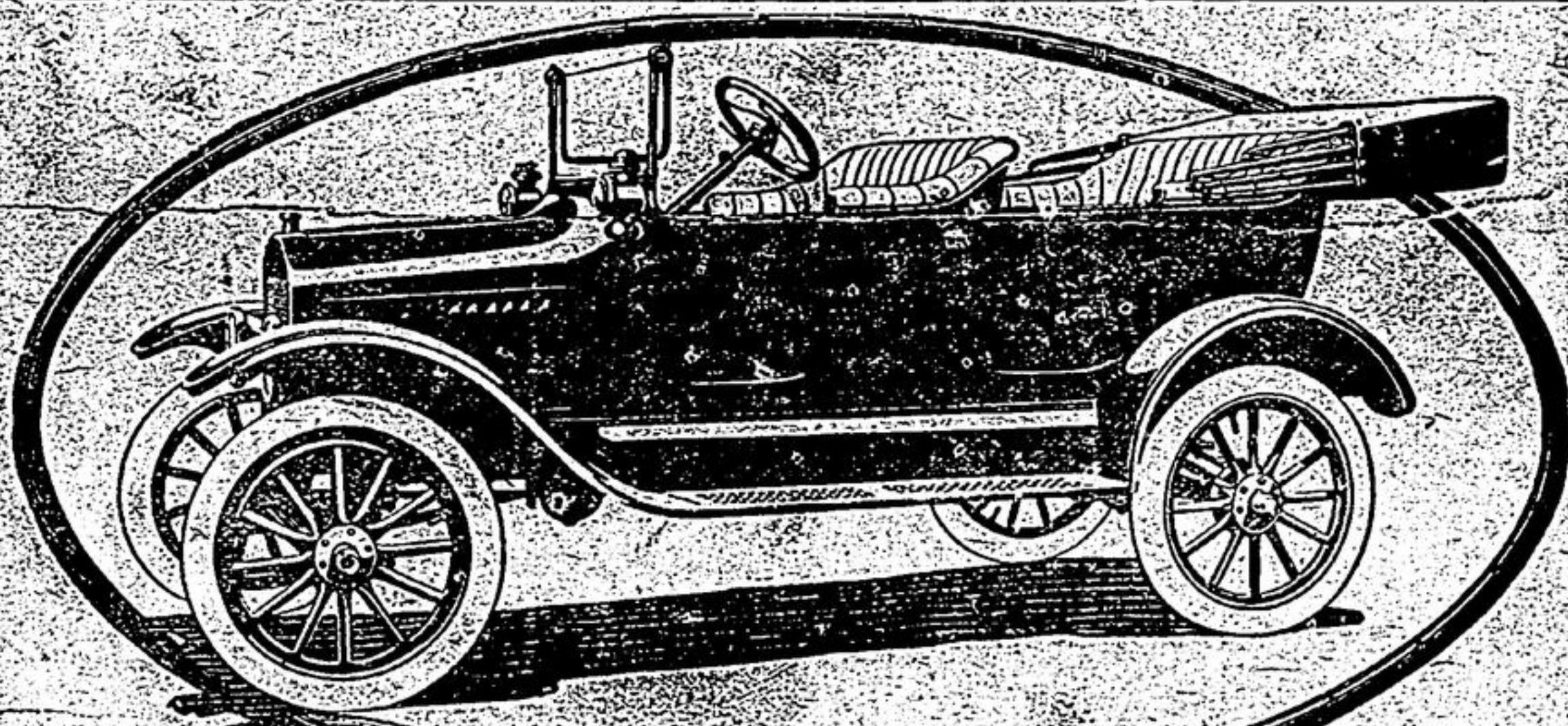

A motion was passed that the library close at 8 o'clock on every night except Saturday night, when it will be kept open until 8.30 during the months of June, July, August and September.

Former Pickering Resident Passed Away

There passed away at Uxbridge, at the home of her daughter, Mrs. John Burnham, on Saturday, March 16, Mrs. Phebe Madill, widow of the late W. H. Madill, in her 88th year. Death was due to pneumonia which set in after the deceased had been confined to her bed for about a year because of the infirmities of old age. Mrs. Madill was a daughter of the late Sylvanus Sharrard, of Claremont. Mr. and Mrs. Madill spent most of their days on the farm in the township of Pickering their home-stand being on the seventh concession. She as well as her husband were universally liked and respected. The latter died some years ago at a ripe old age.

Mrs. Madill is survived by five sons: James, of Pickering township; John, of Stouffville; Joel, of Bradford; J. W., of Castor, Alberta; and Sylvanus of Locust Hill; and one daughter, Mrs. John Burnham, of Uxbridge. The eldest son, Joshua, died a year ago.

The remains were interred at Claremont Union Cemetery on Tuesday forenoon.
