There is an increase in the number of voluntary enlistments in Quebec, it is reported. This is good news. When the French Canadians realize the danger that faces Old France they should not hesitate to rally to the colors and uphold the reputation of their forefathers.

That the common people should be given credit for possessing ordinary common sense is the attitude taken by Sir Sam. Hughes. He is strongly supported in this by Col. J. B. McLean, who, through his several publications, has been urging that the people of Canada be told the truth of what is happening at the front. Speaking in the House on Monday, Sir Sam. aimed a broadside at the Government strongly condemning the use of chloroform upon the Canadian public and the throttling of the press from telling the truth. He stated that there were men in County Councils throughout Canada who could make as good Cabinet material as the men in the Government.

Sir Sam., even by his opponents, has been given credit for a great organizing capacity. We are of his opinion that the Canadian people should be told more of the truth about the war. Covering up defeat only arouses suspicion and discontent among an enlightened people. If it is victory that is reported, the people will rejoice; if it is defeat and they know it, they will only be the more determined to do their share that the enemy may be overthrown.
