

Notice to Citizens
A notice was taken last week, to the effect that all the new to the children spreading of Small-Pox apparently started is totally ill as all the school have been vaccinated and it is the adults to be done also if wish to evade the disease.

There is a great deal of objection to vaccination on account of the resulting sore arm, but incapacity for more than a day or two is the exception and not the rule. Vaccination is a miniature dose of Small-Pox without any Pox breaking out. You often hear it repeated that "I would rather have this type of Small-Pox than be vaccinated" but you must remember that if vaccination is not practiced the disease would soon be back to its very virulent and fatal form again.

There is also a great danger of Epidemic spreading from un-quarantined cases in the neighboring townships over which your Local Board of Health has no control. Several instances have occurred already of these cases coming to town with crusts on their faces and arms.

I think that the majority of the citizens, if they could look into the future, would prefer a sore arm for two or three days than even this mild form of Small-Pox with two or three weeks quarantine.

Dental Inspection

The government, through the Education Department, has sent out instructions and plans to Dr. Smith and Dr. Barker for the Dental Inspection of children's teeth in Stouffville, and the surrounding schools. It is under the supervision of the Provincial Dental Inspector and Public School Inspectors. It has been definitely established that many of the systemic disorders are caused by oral disease, and if they are to be prevented the children's mouths must be examined and the defects discovered while the cavities are still small so as to render devitalization with its sometimes uncertain results, unnecessary.

Drs. Smith and Barker have volunteered to give their services free in order to assist in this work. All the Women's Institutes of the province are co-operating in the work of medical and dental inspection.


