Schools of various conditions and kinds surround us on every side. In the various cities of Canada first class night schools are run regularly during the winter months, which are opened to boys and girls alike, while in the country, there are technical schools, where boys and girls are taught everything needful to enable them to make a success of life.

The hired man of earlier days, the machine, the laborer, will soon be of the past, and in the future, the farm owner, when in a quandary, can turn to his modern hired boy for information and advice.

It is, to a great extent, to the efforts of the Hon. Duncan Marshall, Provincial Minister of Agriculture, that Alberta's agricultural education has been brought to its present standard of efficiency.






