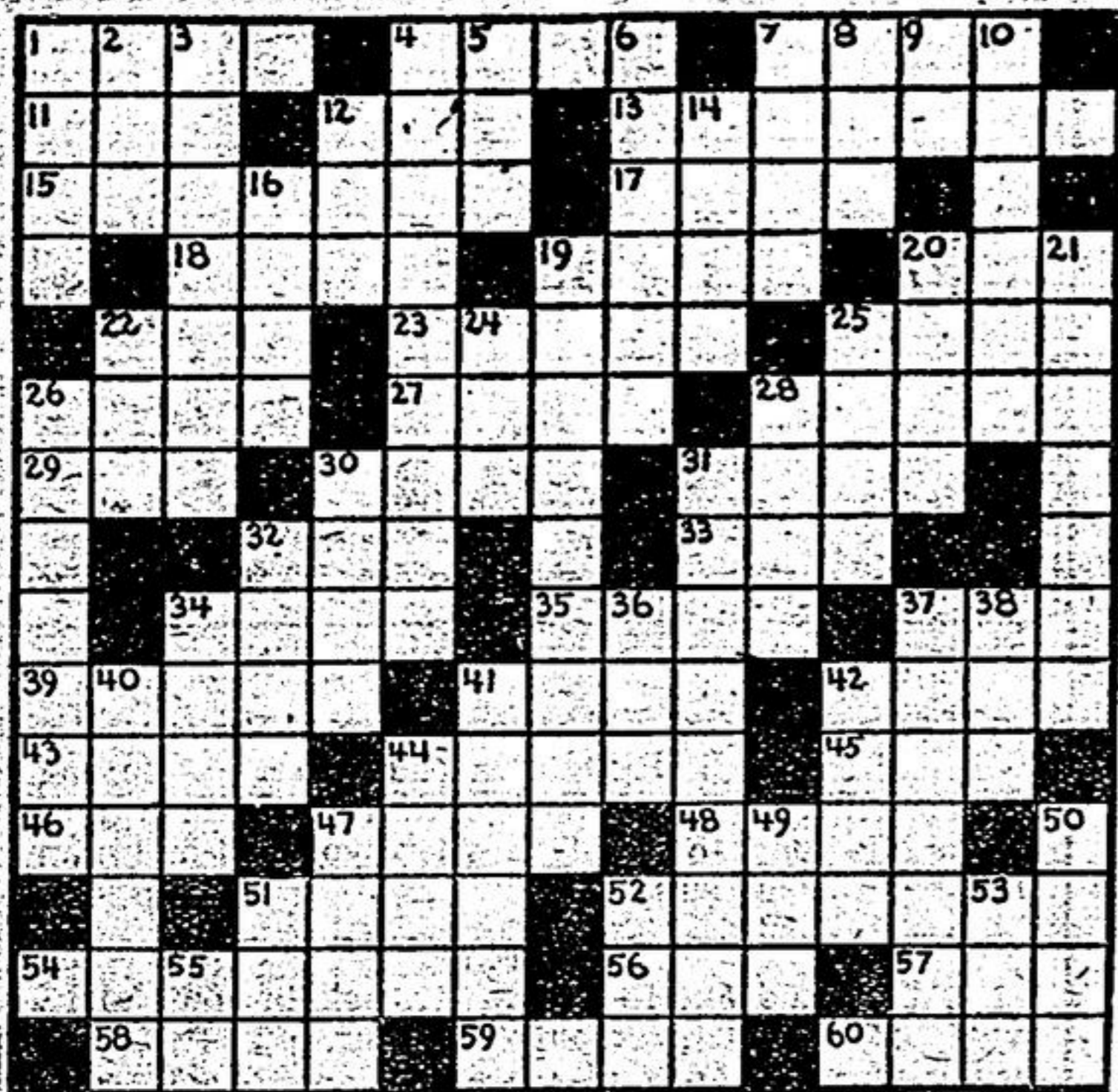

## Surnames and Their Origin

**McKEEVER**  
Variations—MacIvor, MacIver, MacIvr, Emer, Emerson, Iver, Ivor, Ivir, Howard.  
Racial Origin—Iris and Scottish.  
Source—A given name.

This group of family names, which shows such wide variations, is more frequently found among those of Irish ancestry than among the Scots, though there are sept of no less than three Scottish clans which bear the names MacIvor and MacIver. These clans are Robertson, Campbell and Mackenzie.

The name is more properly spelled "MacIomhair" in the Gaelic, but it should be remembered that in that tongue the aspirated "m" is pronounced approximately like a "v."

The clan name is taken from the given name of "Iomhar" (or Ivor), a compound of two Irish words "iom" and "ar," meaning "much slaughter." This name is not to be confounded with the given name of "Ivo," once widespread through England, but now surviving only in a few family names.

The Irish clan name "MacIomhair" traces back to a chieftain who was the great grandson of the "MacDubbghall" (MacDougall) who was king of the Isles in 1144, and who came from that Irish stock to which most of the Highland Scottish blood traces back.

The forms Emer, Emerson and Howard (when the last is not from another source) are only anglicized corruptions of the Irish clan name.

The Scottish MacIvors, in some cases trace back to the Irish clan, and in others have derived their name from other individuals who bore the given name of "Iomhar."

## OYSTERS AND THE PUBLIC HEALTH

### Governments of the United States and Canada Co-operate in Protective Work.

On 15th November, 1925, changes in laws and regulations respecting the taking and shipping of oysters went into effect in the United States and Canada which will have important and far-reaching effects in both countries. The introduction of these changes was necessary not only to safeguard the health of citizens but also to save the oyster business from extinction. During the last few years outbreaks of typhoid fever, particularly in different parts of the United States, were caused from eating oysters from polluted beds. Citizens in both countries were alarmed and in 1924 the consumption of oysters fell to one-quarter of what it had been two or three years before, and gave indications of ceasing altogether. Faced with this situation the different governments concerned took drastic action. In the United States the oyster beds have been examined by federal and state authorities acting independently, and the latter have also instituted an examination in regard to sanitation of all establishments where oysters are opened or "shucked." The state medical service issues to the fisherman a certificate that the bed on which he is licensed to fish is not polluted and also a certificate to the shucker that his premises are sanitary. These certificates are forwarded to the federal Department of Health at Washington when they are checked and filed for reference. Since 15th November every shipment of oysters has had to be accompanied by tags properly filled in showing the name and license number of the fisherman and also the shucker. Without these tags the shipments are not admitted into any state for consumption, and the state medical authorities are in constant communication with Washington to ensure that the licenses are genuine and have not been revoked. As a further check the United States federal government does not issue a visa to a fisherman if its own independent report shows the oyster bed on which he is fishing to be polluted, but settles this point with the state authorities.

In this protective work Canada, through the Department of Health, is actively co-operating. This country is affected in two ways, first as to the export of oysters to the United States, and second, as to the import of oysters from that country. The United States will not allow uncertified oysters to be imported from Canada, and Canada, naturally, requires a like assurance as to the oysters coming in from the United States. This means the inspection and certification of oyster beds in Canada, and further necessitates the inspection of shipments from the United States with the accompanying examination and checking of certificates by the Departments of Health and Marine and Fisheries with the co-operation of the Department of Customs.

Officers of the Department of Health have been for some months engaged in supervising the examination of the oyster beds in the Maritime Provinces, in attending the different meetings in the United States at which the various points were settled, and in furnishing the required information and assistance to the Department of Customs and the Department of Marine and Fisheries.

On account of the cold, clear waters around her eastern coast, Canada produces some of the finest oysters in the world. Unfortunately, for the same reason, since oysters do not propagate or grow when the temperature of the water is lower than 60 degrees F., Canadian oyster beds are not nearly so prolific as beds in warmer waters. It is gratifying for Canadians to know that, with one or two exceptions, the oyster beds of the Maritime Provinces are free from pollution, and that therefore the Department of Health has had no difficulty in regard to the issue of certificates.

Although the regulation of the oyster business was forced upon the United States and Canada because of the menace to health of polluted beds, it will work out to the benefit of the industry in both countries. The health of citizens will be protected and the knowledge that contaminated oysters are not allowed on the market will restore confidence and will undoubtedly result in the return of the business to its old-time vigor and prosperity.
