

Before going any further I must tell you something about our craft To start with, she is called the Short-Rolls-Royce Flying Boat, because she is manufactured by Short Bros, of Rochester, and fitted with two Rolls-Royce engines of 700 h.p. each. The craft is all built of metal, and, incldentally, is the first al-metal British flying-boat and happens to be the largest of its kind in the world. She is nearly a hundred feet in span and over sixty feet in length, and when fully loaded weighs nearly ten tons.

Inside the spacious hulli there is a large cabin provided with beds, workbench, vice, and tool-lockers. There is also a chart desk where the navigator can work out his courses, and ther are cupboards for food and storage bins for first-aid. In fact, we are equipped like any seafaring yacht.
