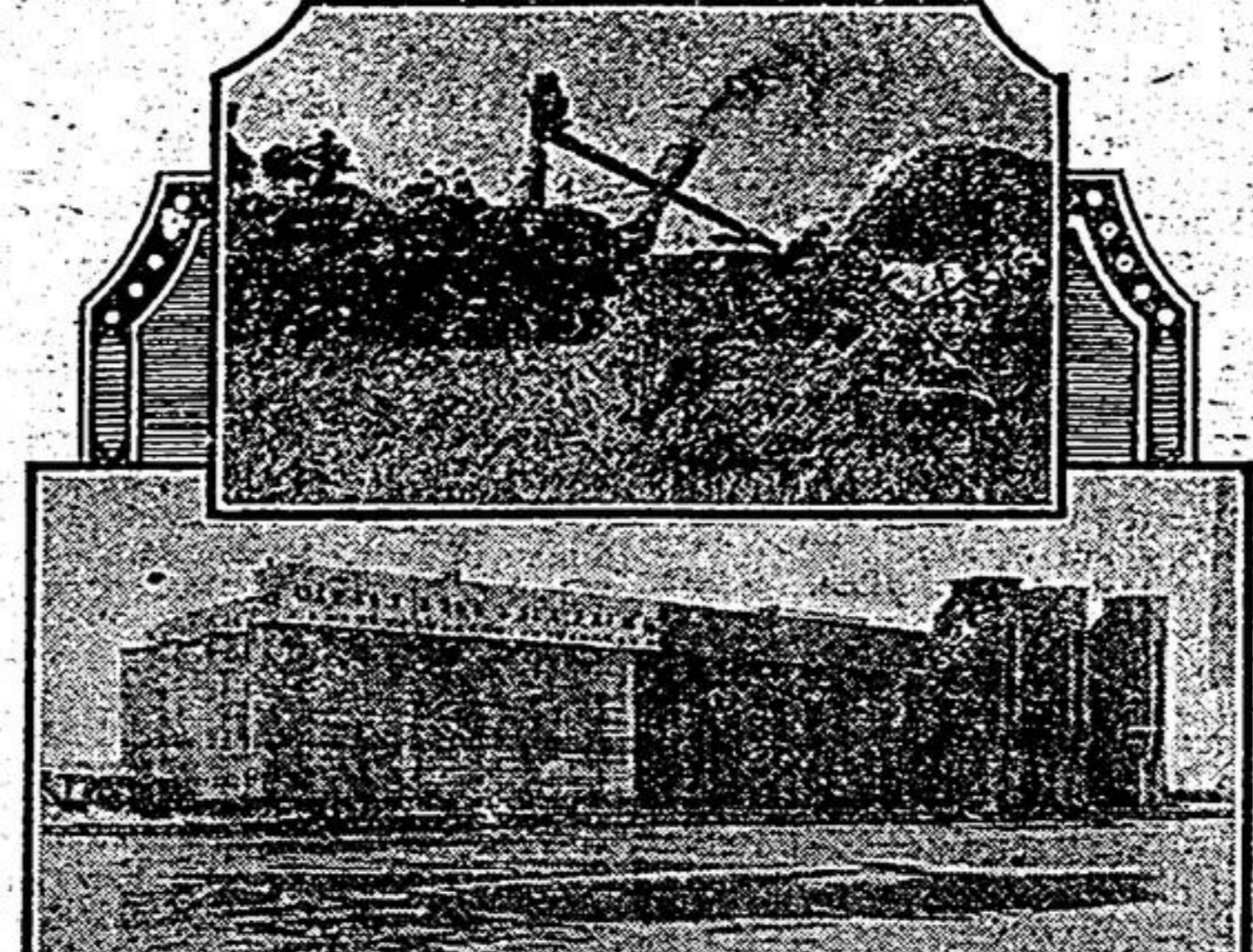

Crop Records Made and Broken

The grain crop for the past year was remarkable in many respects, practically every province equalled or exceeded the harvest of previous seasons, except for the year 1923 which the highest grain record of all time. Due to the lateness of the season combined with the large volume of the crop, new records were established by the Canadian Pacific Railway in handling, transportation and shipping. Though called upon to transport a crop of more than the average capacity, the company did so with greater efficiency than ever.

Alberta created a new record for total yield over its full acreage and individual productions. The province of Ontario was responsible for 21,963,000 bushels of wheat out of the Dominion's full yield of 444,282,000 bushels. There has recently been constructed at Port McNicoll and Midland, elevators with a capacity of two million bushels which greatly facilitated grain handling on the great lakes and has also doubled the Canadian Pacific Railway's storage capacity on Georgian Bay.

Paris—Subway excuses are furnished passengers on the French underground system delayed from arrival at work at a specified time by stoppage or delay of train service. The old alibi of "train late" doesn't go down with the hard-hearted French employer unless accompanied by an official yellow ticket stamped with the date and the name of the station at which the delay occurred. The tickets are furnished by subway and railway officials on request.

Forest Conservation

Ottawa Journal (Cons.): Our spruce forests are rapidly diminishing, with a sure result that at some time in the future, perhaps not very far distant, our Canadian paper mills will find a scarcity of raw material, their production and value will decrease and the price of paper will soar. An argument has long gone on for further restriction of the export of spruce. Some restriction exists now. Restriction is opposed by the contention that it will be an injustice to Canadian farmers who have spruce to sell. But it looks as though the interest of the Dominion at large will be far more hurt by continued export of pulpwood than by a limited number of spruce owners getting—for a short time only—a dollar or two less a cord for spruce than they can get at present.
