

Eastland, Texas.—A horned toad sealed alive in the cornerstone of the court house here thirty-one years ago, was alive when the stone was removed recently, according to County Judge Edward S. Pritchard. The old court house is being razed.

Once Sardinia is chastened, as was Sicily—which is likely to be no easy job, since that island produces Italy's hardiest soldiers—observers of the Premier's campaign are wondering when he will tackle the region of Calabria, comprising three provinces in the toe of the "boot" of Italy. Calabria in 1924 showed 3,285 crimes per 100,000 the murder rate being 22 crimes committed were 33,522, with 19,541 convictions.
