### COUNTY COUNCIL

Few are the questions that come before the members of York County Council that are not settled to the satisfaction of the majority, but in the matter of deciding ways and means to adequately equalize the assessment of the county, the members have struck a snag. At the January session this question was discussed pro and con, after which a committee of all the Reeves was appointed to go fully into the matter and report at this session. This was done and their report presented to the council by Chairman Wesley Gohn on Monday. Immediately with council in Committee of the Whole, discussion arose, which lasted for nearly three hours, after which the committee rose, reported progress, and asked leave to sit again.

The percentage of assessment in Markham Township, according to sales of property registered at the registry office of 15 representative is 63, and in the last 15 sales 50; Whitechurch percentage on last 15 sales was 50, and Stouffville village 52, Markham village 55.
