In the vaults of the Dept. of Health is kept the original registration of every birth, marriage and death occurring in the Province of Ontario. Approximately seven million records are now on file; more than 133,000 birth, marriage and death registrations are added yearly to the records; ever 42,000 certificates are issued each year, while the number of searches reach a yearly total of \$50,000.

' A generation ago the Colonies purchased their manufactured goods very largely from us, and our emigrants still remained customers for our industries, but this is not the case to-day. 


