LEMONVILLE

(From The Akotoks Herald) Little Mary King passed away in the hospital at Calgary, on Wednesday afternoon, Sept. 18th, after an illness of a little over two weeks. She first became sick at Omaha Nebraska, on the way home from Lemonville, and other points in Ontario. She was thought to be suffering from indigestion. In the morning she would improve and be ready to continue the homeward journey. The family arrived at 8 p.m. on Labor Day when medical aid was at once secured, two doctors from Calgary attending her. She grew worse and was taken to the hospital at Calgary on Saturday, Sept. 7th. Peritonitis and double pneumonia developed, and while there were slight changes for better at times the doctors of whom seven at one time held out no hope. One of them was the doctor who brought her into the world at Consort on March 17th, 1917, and who left the hospital finally a day or two before her death with tears in his eyes as he acknowledged the utter inability of medical science to save the sweet young life so swiftly nearing the veil that hides from mortal eyes the life eternal. The funeral was held on Friday, Sept. 20th, from the United Church to the cemetery, and seldom has such a concourse been gathered together testifying to the esteem, respect, and sympathy felt for the sorely stricken parents. Only a portion of those in attendance could get inside the church which was packed to the doors. The choir rendered appropriate music while a duet was sung "In that Beautiful Land". Rev. W. J. Kidd gave a short but beautifully worded address taking as his text the verse from the fifth chapter of Matthew, "Blessed are they that mourn for they shall be comforted." One of the most promising of Okotoks younger generation was still that great day when earth and quietly and reverently laid to rest, sea shall both render up their dead. There were 93 floral offerings. Those being present were Mr. and Mrs. H. King, who had driven 590 miles in 24 hours to be in time for the funeral. Mr. Horce King and wife had only been home two hours, from a trip to Stouffville when they found the telegram awaiting them of the death of their niece.

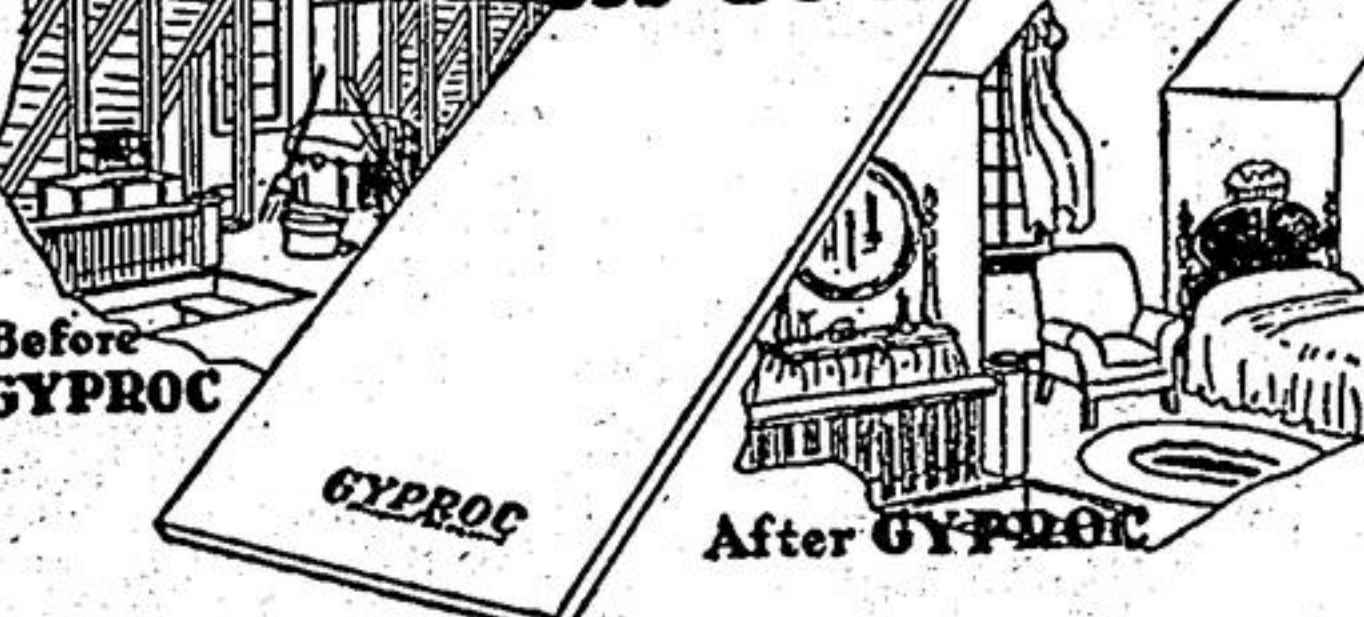

MARKHAM REAL ESTATE
