In order to conform with action taken by the banks in adjacent hours to the public throughout the district the banks in Stouffville wish to announce that commencing Monday June 16th, 1930 banking hours will be as follows; 9.30 a.m. to 3.00 p.m. except Saturdays when the hours will be from 9.30 a.m. to 12.00 o'clock noon.

Since the announcement in the press on the details for a paved road through Stouffville, we have been waiting to hear from the objectors to the scheme sponsored by the civic council, and backed up by a public meeting which almost unanimously requested the council to proceed with the new road. Many a move on the part of our councils in the past which didn't involve an expenditure of more than a fraction of a mill, has caused more flurry and protest than the present big undertaking which is calculated to

increase the tax rate. by six mills. There seems to be an almost unanimous general acceptance of the idea, and whether people like the inevitable increase in taxes, they are disposed to pay rather than turn against the new road proposition. The Toronto and York Road. Commission are now calling for tenders for the work which is being done concurrent with the necessary advertising to permit the local council to proceed with their part of the deal.
