The Farmers Information

(From Dept of Agriculture)

The International Plowing Match and Farm Machinery Demonstration will be held near the City of Peterboro, Ontario, on October 13, 14, 15 and 16, 1931.

Report Was Endorsed
Ontario, through the new marketing council, provided for in the Somerset report, will embark without delay upon sweeping new policies to promote new markets, recapture old ones, and restore to prosperity the fruit and vegetable industry of the province.

500 Flocks Under Inspection
For the season of 1930-31 there are approximately 500 flocks of poultry under inspection in the province under the Ontario policy for approved farm flocks or breeding stations.

Survey of Cattle
Hon. Thomas L. Kennedy has announced his intention to have a survey made of cattle in the province with a view of increasing the production of milk.

Early Oats Gain Favour
Early oats, such as the Alaska and O.A.C. No. 3, have been increasing in popularity throughout the province.

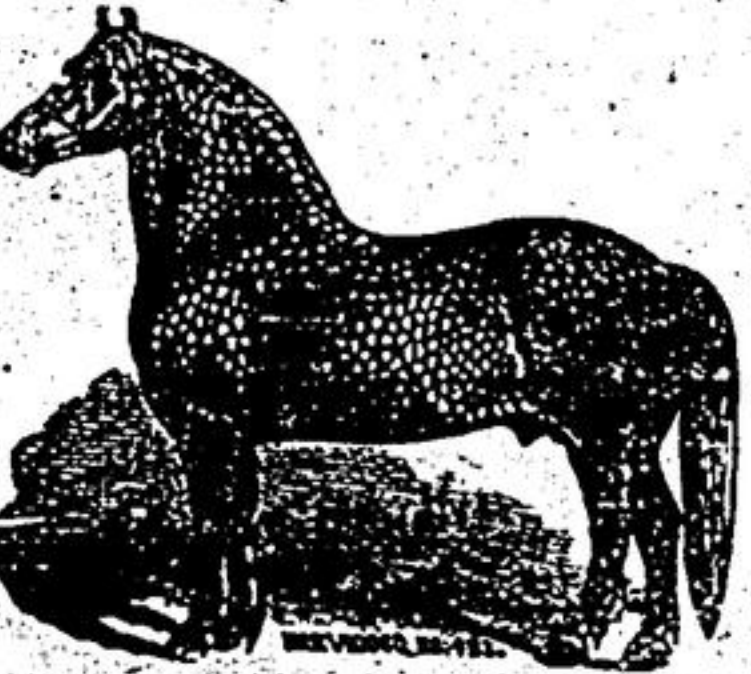
