## Canada's Water Power Resources

Department of the Interior. Estimates Total Resources -Remarkable Advance in Development

Each country develops its powerproducing facilities along the most economically desirable lines and special facilities for power production constitute a definite national advantage. Canada possesses this advantage in a marked degree by reason of the extent and location of her water power resources which are such that, except for a relatively small proportion, her entire settled territory enjoys hydroelectric service. Not only is this true at the present time but there are sufficient undeveloped sites to assure the advantages of this service in the face of expanding demands and advancing settlement.

While complete information regarding the water power resources of the Dominion is not yet available, the Dominion Water Power and Hydrometric Bureau of the Department of . the Interior has collected and analyzed all the stream flow and power data that can be obtained with the purpose of preparing a reliable estimate of the total resources. This estimate places the total power ordinarily available twenty-four hours per day and every day in the year at over twenty million horsepower with an additional thirteen million available continuously. for six months in the year.
