The Electric Eye And Reckless Drivers

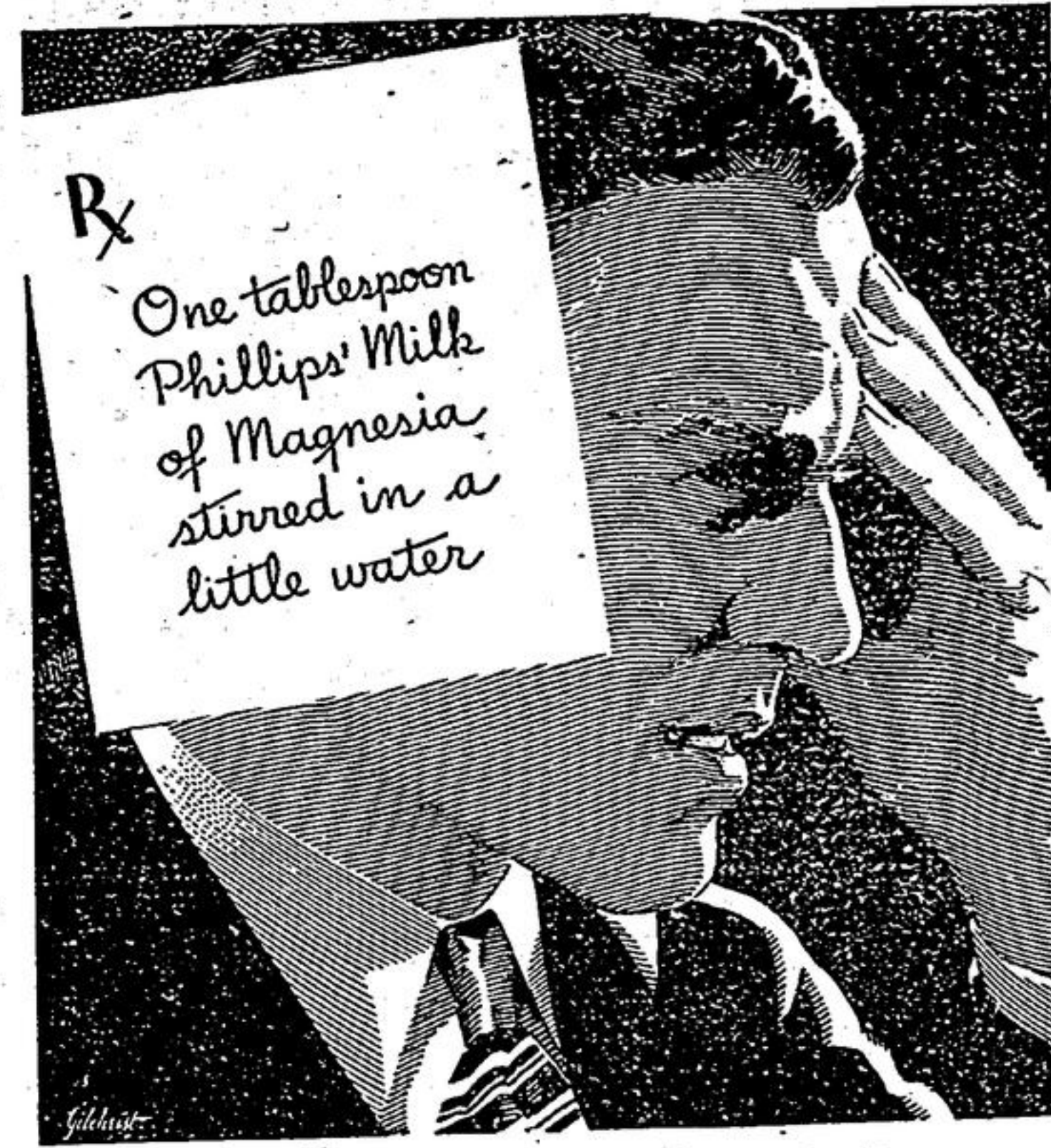
The grim hand of the law is slowly stretching out to reach those foolish people who persist in ignoring the traffic laws when driving automobiles. The latest plan to compel them to obey is an electric eye, which operates just as effectively as if two policemen were stationed along the road operating a speed trap. Photo-cells are concealed in the roadway at stated points, and when a car passes over them a bell is rung in a police telephone booth at a distant point. This bell shows how long the car took to drive from one photo-cell to the other, and if it is in excess of the speed limit the policeman on duty hands the driver a ticket as soon as the latter reaches him, regardless of the speed at which the car is then being driven.

This contraption is now in operation on the old Boston post road leading out of New York, and is said to be producing "perfectly splendid results." If it operates so that no error is made in serving the right driver with the ticket, then it certainly is an invention of which excellent use could be made around Montreal. Toronto already has installed in certain sections the signal lights that stop the driver and then turn green to pass him on when he sounds his horn. 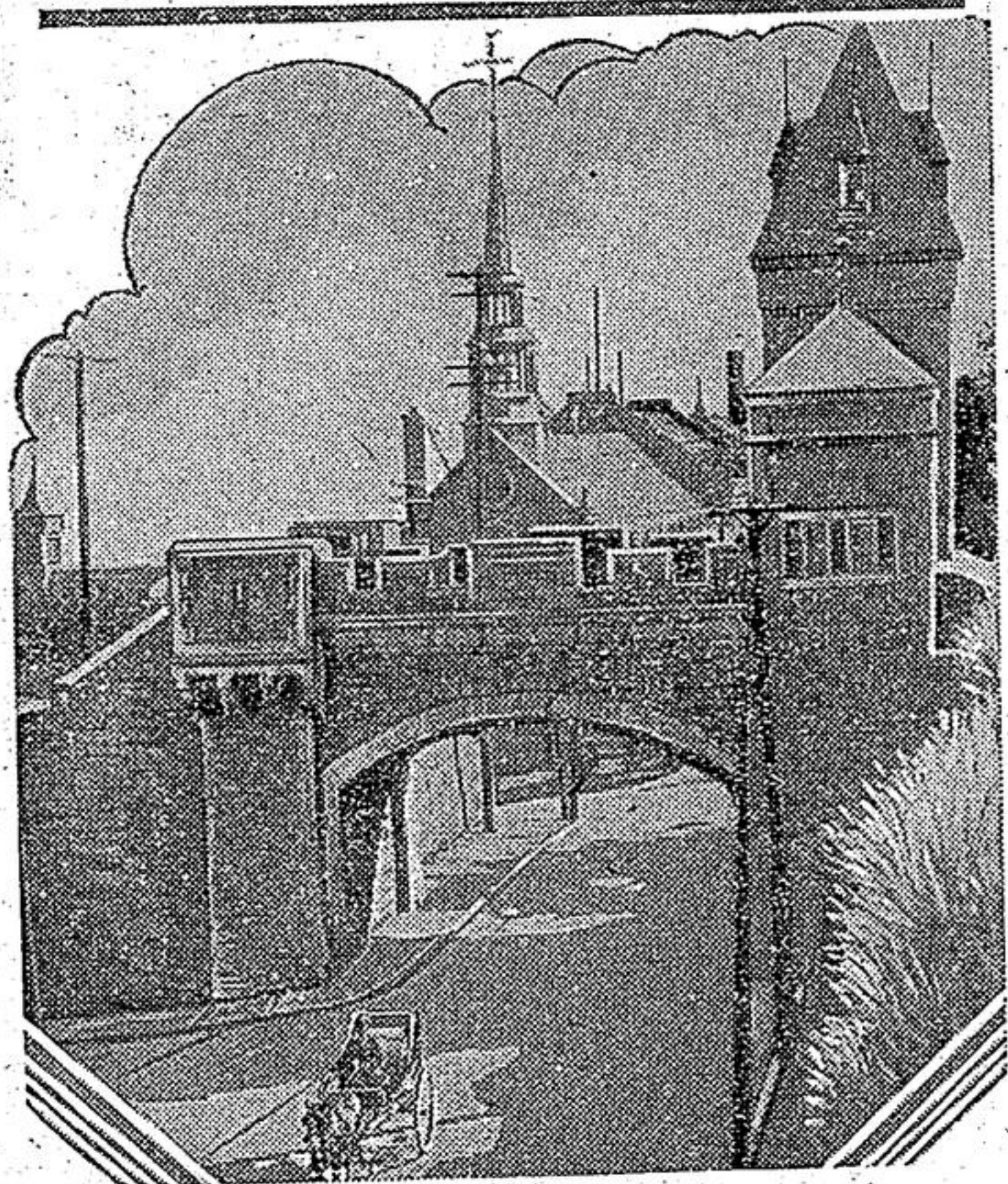

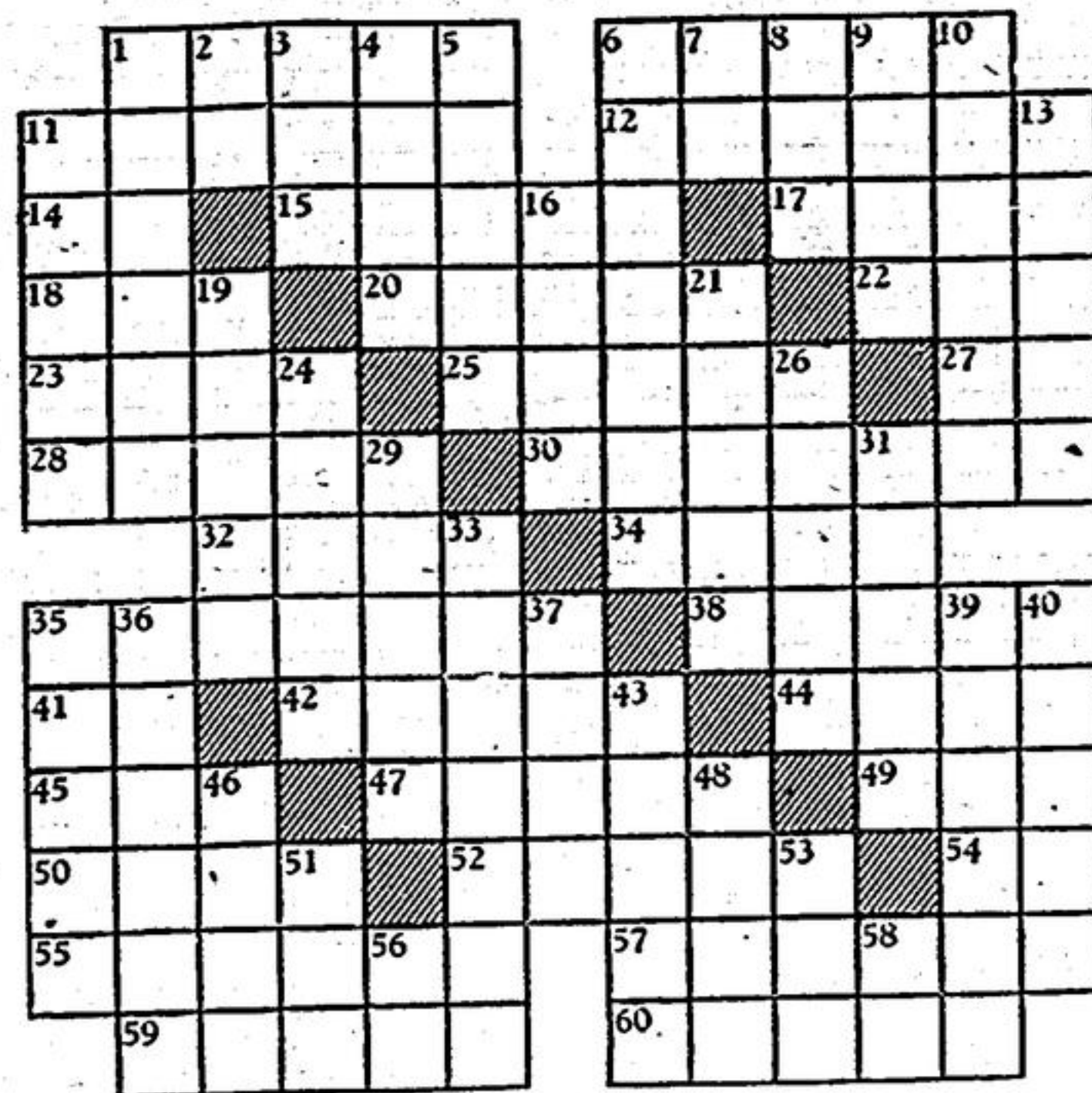

French Committee Formed To Curb Auto Accidents

Paris.—A committee to investigate the pathological causes of motoring accidents on the public highways of France has been named by Justin Godart, Minister of Public Health.

Such accidents, M. Godart points out, constitute a growing danger to the population, and they often are said to be due to some physical or mental weakness of the man at the wheel.

"The heavy meals and the libations of Sunday outings," the Minister observes, "are to a certain degree responsible. But allowance must also be made for the slight disturbance of mental equilibrium which is common and which is augmented by the sensation of speed, the excitement of passing other cars and other incidents of driving an automobile. Moreover, the fatigue of long hours at the wheel weakens and even annihilates the attention and the reflexes."

Several leading medical men have agreed to serve on the committee. They will have the expert assistance of Baron Petet, president of the Chamber of Automobile Constructors; Viscount de Rohan, president of the Automobile Club of France, and Edmond Chaix, president of the Touring Club of France.
