The place of our solourn this year by the sea was an ideal little spot-

"All sand and cliff and-deep inrunning cave." And these words of Tennyson's give MOUNT ROYAL

a very true description of the shores around the peaceful village on the coast, with its little white cots above the golden stretch of sand, sunning themselves in the pure sunlight, sparkling in the clear air. It was an ideal spot for a peaceful sojourn; it is a fair picture to conjure up in the Autumn twilight. How often wil steal back to my memory that little village by the sea, ever as vivid and as fair in color and detail as a picture fresh from an artist's easel; its quaint street, each little fisher-homestead with its well-stocked garden of old-world flowers. . .

In the distance, back from the cliffs, stretched acres of wind-kissed forage, comprised of red sainfoin and giant crimson clover; and farther still stretched the ripening wheat, over which the cloud-shadows played at times, sketching on the miles of verlure, most fanciful pictures.

But the village itself had the greatest charm; ordered and exact in its life day after day, with its homecoming of the fishers at dawn, and the greetings in the little harbor down below; night after night the sailing out of the boats, merry voices down the dim streets at the hour, when the stars were born above the foam. Besides a score of fisherhomesteads a shop or two comprised the village. From open doors might be seen hanging from rafters the tangle of nets, or wives at the thresholds mending the rends in them-the work of stormy nights. A source of great delight were the garlens, not so much for the sake of the flowers but because of the quaint cames bestowed upon the blossoms Honesty was a favorite flower, named by the fishers as "Silks-and-satins"; loved chiefly by most of us for its curious seed vessels, which glimmer like threaded moonstones. (This likeness of mine was verified when I discovered that the meaning of its name Lunaria, referred to the shape and color of the seed-vessels.) Alyseum Maritimum was known only by the name of "Snow-in-Summer," and the golden toad-flax around the garden gates as "Roving sailor."-In "From a Middlesex Garden," by Alfred H Hyatt.

"Weak" Industries To Go Under New Italian Plan

Rome.-Premier Benito Mussolini's 'Industrial Reconstruction Institute,' .lesigned to break the economic crisis and reorganize Italian industry on a healthy basis, has begun the process of weeding out weak and uneconomic industries.

The first decision of the institute as to float a 1,000,000 lire bond issue & finance the "demobilization," which will liquidate weak concerns. The institute is not officially connected with banks, but is limited to industries. A previous financial organization, the "Instituto Mobilaire," was designed to help banks unload their Industrial securities and thaw their frozen assets. The Reconstruction Institute will finance and improve healthy industries able to issue long-term loans and will provide for liquidation of uneconomic concerns through state aid for creditors.

Musolini's plan is for a "clean slate" in the Italian industrial system, just as he believes that a clean slate of war debts and reparations would be the greatest aid to international recovery. The plan probably will be a blow to

tertain firms on the border line making a desperate effort to recuperate. It will wipe out those held to have no thance to make industrial progress. Mussolini expects the institute to settle national industry on a sound basis, nignifying closer state control typical of the Mussolini system.

Crocus Dates Far Back In Horticultural Annals

In Greece and Rome, saffran was used as a perfume. It also was employed extensively as a yellow dye and still is today in certain sections of the old world. Commercial plantings of crotus for the manufacture of saffran are still to be found in Persia, Spain, France and Sicily.







The Western white pins is similar in most respects to the Eastern species but does not form extensive pure stands. It is confined to the Province of British Columbia. red or Norway pine of Eastern Canada is harder and more resinous than the white pine, and the tree is a valuable source of structural timber as well as of sawn lumber. The Western yellow or "oull" pine o: the interior of British Columbia is softer and lighter in color than the red pine, and is now extensively used as a substi-

tute for white pine. There are three hemlock species in Canada's forests, two of which are valuable timber trees. The Eastern emlock is abundant throughout its range in the Eastern Provinces, but is not found west of the Province of Ontario. The wood is chiefly used for construction, especially in house-framir.g. It supplies the demand for a cheap, strong material for many purposes, including poles, mining timber; pulpwood and firewood, and its bark is a valuable source of tannin. The Western hemlock is found in Canada only in the Province of British Colunibia, and is becoming more-valuable each year as its qualities are better appreciated. The Western species is used more extensively than the Eastern in pulp manufacture.

There are only two species of the genus commonly called cedar in Canaca. They are both of great commercial importance, each in its own region as their ranges do not overlap. The wood of the cedars is the most durable conifercus wood grown in the Dominion. The Eastern tree, white cedar, is found from the Atlantic to the south-east part of Manitoba. Ceder is preferred to all other native woods for shingles and for all structural work exposed to moisture, enornous quantities being used for poles and fence posts. The Westerr red cecar is one of the giants of the Pacific coast, being surpassed in size only by the Douglas fir. Its wood is made into slingles to a greater extent than any other wood in Canada, and it is also sawn into lumber.

Texas Supplies Most Mohair.


