### Better Book Public Here Than in the States

How good a book-buying, book-borrowing, book-reading public is the Canadian public? An answer is given by Mr. Hugh Eayrs in the Twentieth Century. From the publishers' point of view there is a great difference between a small population scattered over an enormous territory such as Canada; a very large population with numerous large centres in a somewhat smaller country like the United States and a population much more concentrated in a country many times smaller than either—Great Britain. There are also also many differences of taste in the three countries.

Mr. Eayrs estimates that if the peoples in each of these countries—the United States, the British Isles and Canada—were all so made that they were a possible public for precisely the same kind of reading matter, there should be in the United States a book-buying public twelve times as large as Canada's and in the British Isles a public five times that of Canada. He finds, however, that we have, per capita, not so good a book public as England, but a better one than the United States. Figures of book importation and domestic manufacture for the three countries show England first, Canada second, the United States third. In respect of magazine reading the order is reversed: the United States leads, Canada is second, England third.—Toronto Mail and Empire.
