ROMANCE OF NICKEL INTERESTING STORY

Montreal, Sept 10-In the romance of metals nickel is one of the outstanding examples, says the Natural Resources Department of the Canadian National Rallways. Since then the nickel industry has grown by leaps and bounds until today nickel ranks nineth in quantity among the metals consumed annually throughout the world.
