A law that is being broken most every day in Stouffville according to our information, is that respecting the sale of cigarettes and tobacco to minors. Prosecutions have been going on in other municipalities for selling cigarettes to boys and girls under age, and it what our informant tells us is correct, its about time someone was made an example of in this village. For the guidance of those who do not know, here is the regulations on the matter: "No person can legally sell, or give or furnish, directly or indirectly, cigarettes or cigarette papers or tobacco in any form, to any boy or girl under the age of 18 years. The onus of proving the age is on the Dealer, his clerk, servant or agent."

The following exception to above regulation is, "When a boy or girl has a written order signed by their parent or guardian, but no one else. dated and stating the kind and quantity of tobacco required. Also this written order must accompany overy individual purchase."
