#### Chickens for Britain

In the past few months there has been an increased demand for Canadian chickens from British buyers. The largest shipment in 20 years-4,000 boxes-is now en route to Britain. The birds in this . shipment were mostly assembled in Winipeg. and were packed according to Government standards and Governmentinspected.

Last September the British Government imposed a duty of six cents per pound on poultry imported from foreign countries. This has caused the British buyers to look more to Canada and the other. British Dominions for their supplies. Coupled with the fact that a reputation is being built up for Canadian Government-inspected poultry, this is creating the greatest demand for several

Last Christmas Canada shipped over 1,000,000 pounds of chilled turkeys and chickens to Britain, which created a decidedly favorable impression. These shipments all went: forward packed, graded and inspected according to Canadian Government standards .- Canada Week by Week.



# Peas in Canada

Until recent years most of the do mestic requirements for canned peas were supplied by Ontario, or by im portation from Europe, but Quebec and British Columbia have established and expanded in output rapidly. In 1921 the recorded acreage of canning peas was 2,202 acres in Cntario. In 1931, Ontario had 9,385 acres; Quebec -3,161 acres; British Columbia 418, and small acreages in other provinces brought the total to 13,248 acres. In the past year or two, imports of this product had been negligible, and the Canadian pack is finding export markets as a result of its high quality. Exports amounted to 34,341 cases in the 1932 crop season; practically to Empire markets .- The Agricultural Situation Bulletin.

OTTAWA-Consumption of Canadian cigarettes increased during the past fiscal year. The total entered for consumption for the first 11 months of the past year was 4,017,674-385, according to a return tabled in the House of Commons. For the entire fiscal year 1932-33 the total was 3,728,832,089.

The object of the packing house and the government in assisting in this way is to try and hold for Canada its share of the English bacon market, thus assuring the farmers a better price for their hogs.
