ONTARIO INCOME TAXES ANNOUNCED

All annual incomes exceeding \$1,000 for single persons resident in Ontario and exceeding \$2,000 for married persons will be taxed by the Hepburn Government.

The rates will range from 1 1-2 per cent to 28 per cent in the lowest and topmost brackets, respectively. Single persons earning \$1,000 in excess of exemptions shall-- be subject to a tax of \$15, or 1 1-2 per cent., and 2 per cent. on the amount

and does not exceed \$2,000. Married persons who are childless earning an income of \$2,000 in excess of exemptions shall be subject to a tax of \$35.00, and 2 1-2 per cent upon the amount by which the income exceeds \$2,000 and does not
