Coconut Comes to the Party
Guests exclaim with surprise and delight over the number of varieties of little cakes decorated and made specially delicious with coconut.

"Who would think that you could evolve so many different kinds" — they say as they insist on trying one of each and then probably starting all over again! Just try for yourself how many you can make in a one-hour's session with the bake board! You'll promptly want to give a party to show them off — but you will have to give it quickly before the family tastes them, for the batch certainly won't last long then!

Coconut Crested Cakes, Coconut Jelly Balls, Coconut Maroon Puffs, Rolled Coconut Cookies and Coconut Date Kisses are suggested and the fun of making them is really exhilarating.

Coconut Macaron Puffs
5 tablespoons granulated sugar, 5 tablespoons powdered sugar, 1 tablespoon flour, 2 egg whites, ¼ teaspoon vanilla, 1 cup coconut, premium shredded.

Sift together sugars and flour. Beat egg whites until foamy throughout; then add sugar mixture, 2 tablespoons at a time, beating thoroughly after each addition. Fold in vanilla and coconut. Drop from teaspoon on ungreased heavy paper. Bake in slow oven (325 deg. F.) 20 to 25 minutes. Makes 18. Coconut Almond Macaroons may be made by adding 1-3 cup ground, blanched almonds to mixture, before folding in coconut.

Coconut Date Kisses
2 egg whites, 1 cup powdered sugar, 1 cup coconut, premium shredded, 1 cup finely chopped dates.

Beat egg whites until foamy throughout; add sugar, 2 tablespoons at a time, beating after each addition until sugar is blended. Then continue beating until mixture will stand in peaks. Fold in coconut and dates. Drop from teaspoon on ungreased heavy paper. Bake in slow oven (325 deg. F.) 20 minutes, or until delicately browned. Makes 2½ dozen kisses.

Rolls Coconut Cookies
2 cups coconut, premium shredded, ½ cup heavy cream, 2 cups sifted cake flour, 1 egg, unbeat, 1½ teaspoons baking powder, ¼ teaspoon salt, ½ cup butter or other shortening.

Add ¼ cup coconut to cream; let stand. Sift flour once, measure, add baking powder and salt, and sift again. Cream butter thoroughly; add sugar gradually, creaming until light and fluffy; then add egg and beat thoroughly. Add flour, alternately with cream, mixing well after each addition. (Lill. Roll 1-8 inch thick on slightly floured board Cut with floured 3½-inch cutter and place on ungreased baking sheet. Sprinkle with remaining 1½ cups coconut. Bake in hot oven (400 deg. F.) 12 to 14 minutes, or until delicately browned. Makes 2½ dozen medium cookies. Cut in fancy shapes; decorate with coconut, nuts, raisins, strips of citron or dates, bits of candied pineapple or cherries, small cinnamon candies, or colored sugar, if desired. These cookies and other crisp cookies will keep fresh for some time when packed in a jar or tin with a tight-fitting cover, and stored in a cool, dry place.

Mince Pie Without Meat
1½ cups chopped apples, ¼ cup raisins, seeded and chopped, ¼ cup cranberries, chopped, ¼ cup currants 1 tablespoon shredded citron peel, ¼ cup suet, ¼ teaspoon salt, ½ teaspoon cinnamon, ½ teaspoon nutmeg, ¼ teaspoon cloves, 3-4 cup sugar, 3-4 cup juice from canned fruit, or ½ cup water and ¼ cup vinegar from sweet pickles.

Mix in order given, and boil for about 15 minutes. This quantity fills one very large or two small pies.

Lemon Sponge Pie
2 egg yolks, 2 tablespoons butter, 2 tablespoons flour, 1 cup sugar, rind and juice of 1 lemon, 1 cup milk, heat before mixing with other ingredients.

Beat white of 2 eggs and add kin, Elora, Ont. last. Bake with crust. — Betty Ran-

CALLANDER, Ont.—(Written for the Canadian Press by Joan Anne Fulford, aged 10).—They have a jail at the quintuplets home to put them in when they are bad girls. It is a room to one side of the playground in which I watched them play for an hour.

When one of the babies is disobedient the nurse takes her by the hand and leads her to the room where she leaves her all-alone for a few minutes. But when I saw the nurse putting them there it didn't seem to do much good as they always got into mischief again a few minutes later. They did not actually cry when they were in the jail but when the nurse was leading them to it they kicked and screamed a bit. No one else calls it a jail but I thought that was a good name for it. I'm afraid I saw them on a bad morning for they were often in the room then. In the afternoon they were much better girls and I didn't see them taken away once.

They did some very cute things and often made the visitors laugh. Cecile, who is mischievous, took off her toque and the nurse had to run after her. When she finally caught her and got the toque on her head she took it right off again. The nurse was patient and put it on again. This time she fastened the strap that goes under the chin. Cecile left it on then as something else attracted her attention.

The quintuplets have a great time trying to get through the gate that leads to their rest room. One time Annette and Cecile were both caught in the little gate. They fell down and began to scream. It wasn't really crying. They just wanted to call the nurse to open the gate and rescue them.

It is very seldom the quintuplets fight but Yvonne and Cecile both wanted a chair at the same time. They were each pulling on it when the nurse saw them. She came and took Cecile away as Yvonne had the chair first.

Another time Marie was playing on the prairie.

With a doll carriage and Yvonne came along and started snatching at it. The nurse made Yvonne let go and stop pestering Marie. I seem to have said a lot about them being naughty and Dr. Dafoe may not like that, but that was what interested me most. But they are very nice to each other usually.

Once Cecile got into her wagon and Marie pulled her. Everyone says Marie likes playing horse. She pulled the wagon all around the cement walk in the playground and Marie got a ride.

In the morning of the day I saw them they wore blue woollen outfits with pink scarfs and black cloth goshes. But in the afternoon they had no scarfs and wore white rubbers instead of the goshes. It was cold but they were well bundled up. Perhaps that is why they don't cry when they fall. The guards told me that they sometimes fall three or four feet from their climbing ladders, and just get up and brush themselves off.

The babies seem to like to keep themselves very clean. Once when Annette fell down on her hands and got snow on her white mittens she ran over to the nurse and showed her that she was brushing them off carefully.

It is hard to say that one of them is nicer than the rest because they are so much alike hardly anyone can tell them apart. But I liked Cecile best. Perhaps that was because she laughed so much. All of them laugh a lot and seem to be very happy. They laugh most when they are running away from their nurses.

Kisses in Movies Cause of Romances

This view was expressed by Dr. Herman Eisler, a Viennese psychologist, in an address in Hollywood. Artificial kisses of the screen, he believes, lead to the real kisses of married life.

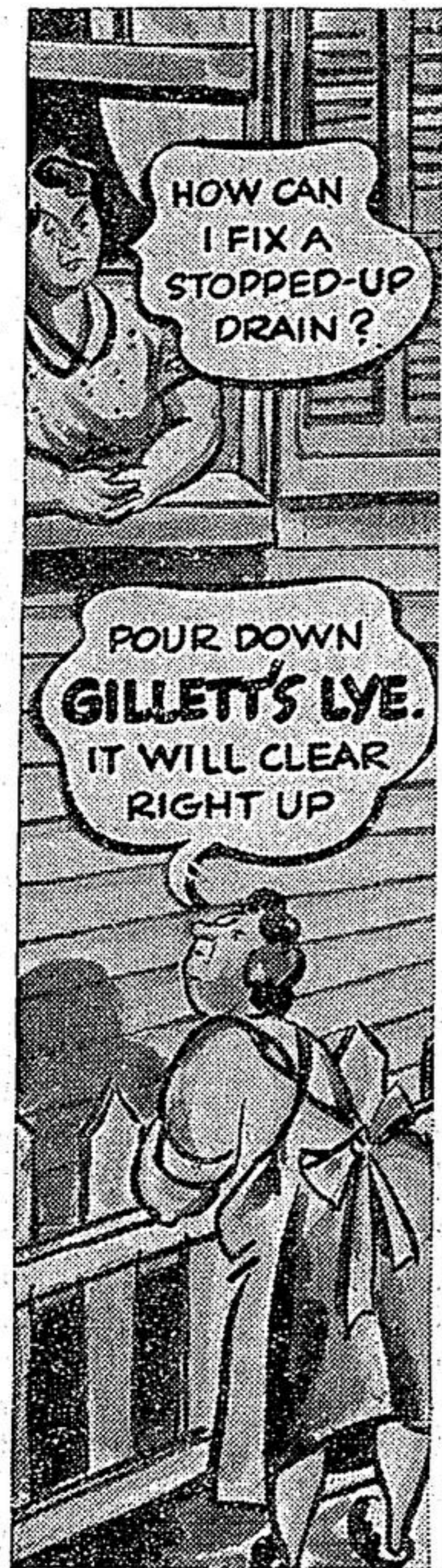
He said that studies in Austria had convinced him that marriages increased in certain districts after the exhibition of pictures with passionate love scenes.
