### Journey Towards "Island In Sky"

Scientists Climb up to Plateau a Mile and a Half High

A party of scientists winged across Grand Canyon of Arizona this week on the first leg of a perilous journey to an "Island in the Sky" they hope will take them 35,000 years back into history.

They plan to begin a gruelling climb up Shiva's Temple, a mile and a half high plateau that juts straight up from the gorge's floor.

What they will find atop this wooded relic of that ancient time when receding glaciers cut away the soil around it and left stranded all the creatures that inhabited it they do not know. Not in the memory of man has anyone scaled the temple.

Creatures 35,000 Years Old How the descendants of those marooned creatures-probably only spruce squirrels-have survived the ages is what the scientists headed by Dr. Harold E. Anthony of the American Museum of Natural History, and Edwin D. McKee, chief naturalist of Grand Canyon National Park, seek to

They will set traps and, returning with their specimens, compare them with their cousins - descendants of those beasts fortunate enough to escape isolation when the glacier glided by. By this means they hope to learn important facts concerning the effect of environment on species.

Dr. Anthony and his aids will remain on the temple indefinitely.

After spending a short time on the plateau, half of the party will return to the north rim to find a means of scaling Wotan's Throne, a towering formation similar to Shiva's Temple but even more formidable.

Supplies by Parachute . Supplies will be dropped to the scientists by parachute. The top of the temple is so densely covered with forest that landing a plane would be impossible.

The party will communicate with the outside world by short wave radio.

#### Canada Needs More People

C. N. R. Official Says Development Tied up With Immigration That Canada must have more

population if it is to fulfill the destiny that nature intended for it, was the contention before the annual convention of the Canadian Chamber of Commerce meeting in Vancouver. of Dr. W. J. Black, Director of Colonization and Agriculture for the Canadian National Railways.

With one-sixteenth of the cultivable land in the world and more than that fraction of the world's natural resources, Canada nevertheless had only half of one per cent of the population. Canada's development is, and always has been, tied up with immigration, he said ..

Farming Families Wanted

To the criticism that immigration would take away the opportunities of the younger generation. Dr. Black replied no part of Canada has had less immigration the past, 25 years than the Maritimes, yet the movement during this period to the United States and elsewhere had been perhaps heavier than for any other part of the Dominion. The Maritimes had not benefited by it and; there were many today who believed an influx of farming families would have good effect.

Looking at the drought areas on the Prairies, Dr. Black said the sade difficulties there still did not justify; the lack of settlement in areas where families can succeed. He believed some of the perplexities of the past few years were due to rural population attracted to industry by high wages prevailing during the good years unable to find its way back to the farm without funds.

#### Calls Banking Boring Business

Cashier Claims it Can Turn Person Into a Cabbage

Banking is the most monotonous work that'a man can do. It will turn him into a "cabbage" if he has no outside interests as well. You can take that from W. G. Bryant, a London cashier, looking back meditatively at 47 years in the Bank of England. The oldest member of the staff, he retires.
