RECORDS PRESERVE

Records Preserve Renowned Voices Famous Collections In Edison Laboratories

In the Edison Laboratories in East Orange, N.J., says the Moncton Transcript, the voices of Theodore Roosevelt, Florence Nightingale, Sarah Bernhardt, Disraeli and other prominent people of the past have been transcribed from the old wax cylinders by a new technical process.

Are Transcribed Florence Nightingale's voice, by this method, has been heard on the radio. The vigorous, enthusiastic tones of Roosevelt addressing boys 25 years ago boomed forth again a year ago for the benefit of the Boy Scouts, Canadians included.

Disraeli, one fears, is out. He died in 1881. The first wax cylinders were made in 1885 by Charles Sumner Tainter and Chichester A. Bell, the latter a cousin of Alexander Graham Bell by the way. It is true that Edison had made some progress with the phonograph by 1881, but if a Disraeli record on a wax cylinder exists it must have been made by George Arliss.

What Gladstone Said Possibly Gladstone was intended. Some biographer has told of Gladstone speaking on the new contraption and specifying long after the recording instrument had stopped. "What did Gladstone say in '78?" was once a rhetorical question. Moderns may at least know how he spoke years afterwards.

Pickaback Plane Value Questioned

British Magazine Holds Disadvantages Apparent In Composite Craft

Doubt as to the practicability of Great Britain's Maya-Mercury composite airplane—one plane sits on top of another for launching purposes—was expressed by the current number of "Aeroplane".

The Maya-Mercury underwent successful tests last week. The big Maya machine took off with the Mercury perched in the fashion of a papoose on a squaw's back. When the mother-ship had gained a good altitude, the smaller plane took off faultlessly.

The system may be applicable to mail transport on the projected trans-Atlantic service, said the article in "Aeroplane", but the review contended passengers could not be entrusted to the Mercury because of its inability to take off once it had landed. The article further cast doubt on the plane's ability to float for any great length of time.

Alton Clark of the Quebec province governed Magdalen Islands in the Gulf of St. Lawrence, wrote this message on a piece of paper and set adrift in a small ink bottle: "If any one finds this please write to Alton Clark, Magdalen Islands, Que., dated April the first."

All last summer passed with no word of his floating ink bottle. Just before Christmas he received a letter postmarked in France and containing the slip of paper he had set adrift about nine months before.

The message had been picked up by a French boat in the Atlantic in August. There was no one on board who could read English and it was taken back to France for translation.

BRITISH COLUMBIA'S New Mining Town

There are 375 Men and Six Women in Zeballos Area; Government Is Guarded About Gold Discoveries.

ZEBALLOS, B.C. — British Columbia's newest gold-mining "boom" town is rising today out of the rocky terrain of Vancouver Island's west coast.

A cluster of frame buildings already has been set up along the town's only street, now knee-deep in mud. Beyond this tents and shacks dot the hills, housing 375 men and six women who have come to stake gold claims or work on mining development.

Influx of Prospectors Three restaurants and a 16-room hotel have been equipped to take care of the influx of prospectors and job-hunters, arriving on ships that call three times a month to establish the only contact with the outside world.

Two more hotels are under construction. A beer-parlor license has been granted for the rising settlement. A post office and a mining recorder's office have been established since the gold hunters started arriving in a procession that started in 1935 and gained momentum during the last few months.

As yet there is no church, no dance halls.

Ten Major Developments

In a radius of 15 miles over hills six-feet deep with snow, between 600 and 1,200 claims have been staked. Ten major developments are being worked.

The steamer Maquina has been unloading from 30 to 75 passengers on its thrice-monthly calls. The ship can approach only within a quarter of a mile of shore. There passengers and freight are transferred to a scow which brings them within a few feet of land. Passengers are carried from the scow by men who wade out from shore in hip-length rubber boots.

Mining properties are mostly along the Zeballos river which courses inland from Zeballos arm, an inlet half-way to the island's west coast. Gold values have been high in certain instances but Government reports on inspection of samples have been guarded.

GARDENING

PREPARATIONS

In few other things does a little preliminary planning yield such tangible returns as in gardening. It is possible to construct a house without a blue print, though the job will usually be regretted. Gardens, too, can be created in this fashion but the results are apt to be confused with the natural conglomeration of weeds, tin cans and abandoned motor cars which litter the usual vacant lot.

A little planning is most essential and it will enhance the interest in the hobby, pastime, work or whatever gardening is called, as well as add very materially to its real value. Now, while the earth is still dormant, or at least too wet or too cold to indulge in any but the hardest kind of planting, is the time to begin these plans. All that is necessary is a pencil and paper, a seed catalogue, and possibly a Government bulletin or two.

SHRUBBERY

For the permanent sort of gardening, that is the kind using perennial flowers, shrubs, trees, grass and other things that grow for years, some preliminary planning is absolutely essential. True, most Canadian garden authorities advocate informal planting for the average home surroundings, but even in simple informality some previous notion of the final results is desirable. Otherwise, there are going to be tiny shrubs hidden by large ones, grass is going to be too shaded in one quarter and delicate flowers burnt up in another.

Even in the vegetable patch, it is a splendid idea, so the horticulturists state, to plot the whole patch roughly to scale, and then lay out the rows so that tall corn, staked tomatoes and similar things have plenty of room each way, but beans, carrots and beets do not get more than from 15 to 24 inches between the rows.

NURSERY STOCK

Early spring is generally considered the most favourable season for planting nursery stock. Under the latter heading comes a wide variety of plants, including rose bushes, shrubs, fruit and ornamental trees, perennial flower plants, vines, raspberry bushes, asparagus, strawberry plants and a host of other permanent things.

In purchasing such material authorities emphasize the importance of securing fresh stock from a reliable Canadian source. Roots and stems should be pliable and moist and if there is any upper growth, as in the case of shrubs and trees, there should be evidence of live green buds.

Nineteenth Century Influence Is Favored

In Paris Showings; Hobble Skirts, Short, Flared Tunics

PARIS. — The nineteen hundreds firmly hold their place in the summer style map. The sheaths of 1911 and the 1913 hobble skirts with short, flared tunics or low-draped pannier gowns are favored by Balenciaga and Charles James for late afternoon and evening.

The Charles James daytime mode is very individual, fitted by strangely curved darts outlined and dramatized by shaped folds or tucks reminiscent of the lines of 1910 "art nouveau" furniture. This technique adds to long box coats or cut-aways forms the synthesis of pre-war impressions.
