In many respects, the story Samson is one of the saddest in the Bible. He began so well. He gained many mighty victories. But he failed so terribly because he had not learned, as Paul did, to keep under his body and bring it into subjection (1 Cor. 9:27). Therefore he became a castaway for a time, though restored at the very last. His biography is pregnant with instruction for all who profess to know God and seek to serve him in any capacity -It is a solemn warning against confusion, from which they were playing with sin in any form.
