5,000 MARKHAM TULIPS FOR KING AND QUEEN

An order of 5000 red tulips was placed for the city of Toronto, last week with Markham Florists, to form part of a display on May 22 when the King and Queen are in the city.

The Markham proprietor, whose yearly stock of tulips run around 300,000 tells us that this large single order must be held in readiness and checked to appear at their very fullest bloom on the day of the royal visit. It is expected that they will be on display in Exhibition Park.

The Markham hot houses are also nursing along several thousand blue and white iris blooms for which it is expected they will find ready sale, to round out the predominating red, white and blue color scheme. The tulip bulbs being used to fill the Toronto order are all imported Holland stock.

Mustons of Stouffville are holding in readiness a large supply of roses for the royal guests. These will be distributed by Muston's Toronto Stores for the occasion.

Birds and Bees Found in the Mail

No Baby Chicks in Local Office, but Bees Oddly Arrive in Stouffville Mail

Enquiries at the local post office bring forth the information that thus far there have been no baby chicks pass through the mail this spring, although this is a popular method of transportation. However bees often pass through this office, but no one gets stung. Possibly the heavy advertising done by local producers is responsible for stemming the need of buying baby chicks away from home.

Strange sounds have been coming from the parcel post packages in the Toronto office during the past week, it is admitted by the district director of postal services, but the clerks have not been alarmed.

Most of the noises proved upon investigation to be the chirping of baby chicks or the buzzing of bees, Mr. Gibson explained. "The arrival of spring has brought the usual annual rush of newly-hatched chicks," he said. "But as the post-office cannot undertake to feed or water them, they have to be mailed when they are less than day old. And as chicks don't require feeding during their first three or four days of life, they are accepted by the post-office for mailing, providing they reach their destination within that time."

Just the same, he admitted, there were plenty of chirps of protest from the little balls of yellow fluff.

Bees, too, he said were beginning to arrive from the southern states. "The post-office will deliver not only queen bees with their attendants, but also plain honey bees if they are properly packaged and can be forwarded to their addressee within five days," Mr. Gibson said. Unlike the baby chicks, which are entitled to postal transportation from March 1 to June 15 only, bees are legal postal matter at any time of year.

Post-office regulations are strict about livestock, but there is a further exception, Mr. Gibson said. "An occasional shipment of leeches is imported for medical use. But I doubt if we get them very often."

The writer started out to find a leech, and finally tracked one down at a drug store. The druggist does a fair business in selling them to relieve swelling and pain inherent in black eyes. He explained they were brought in from New York by parcel post, packed in cartons of damp earth, and as they were able to survive on the moisture required no feeding, even on long trans-Atlantic trips. Most of them originally come from Europe.

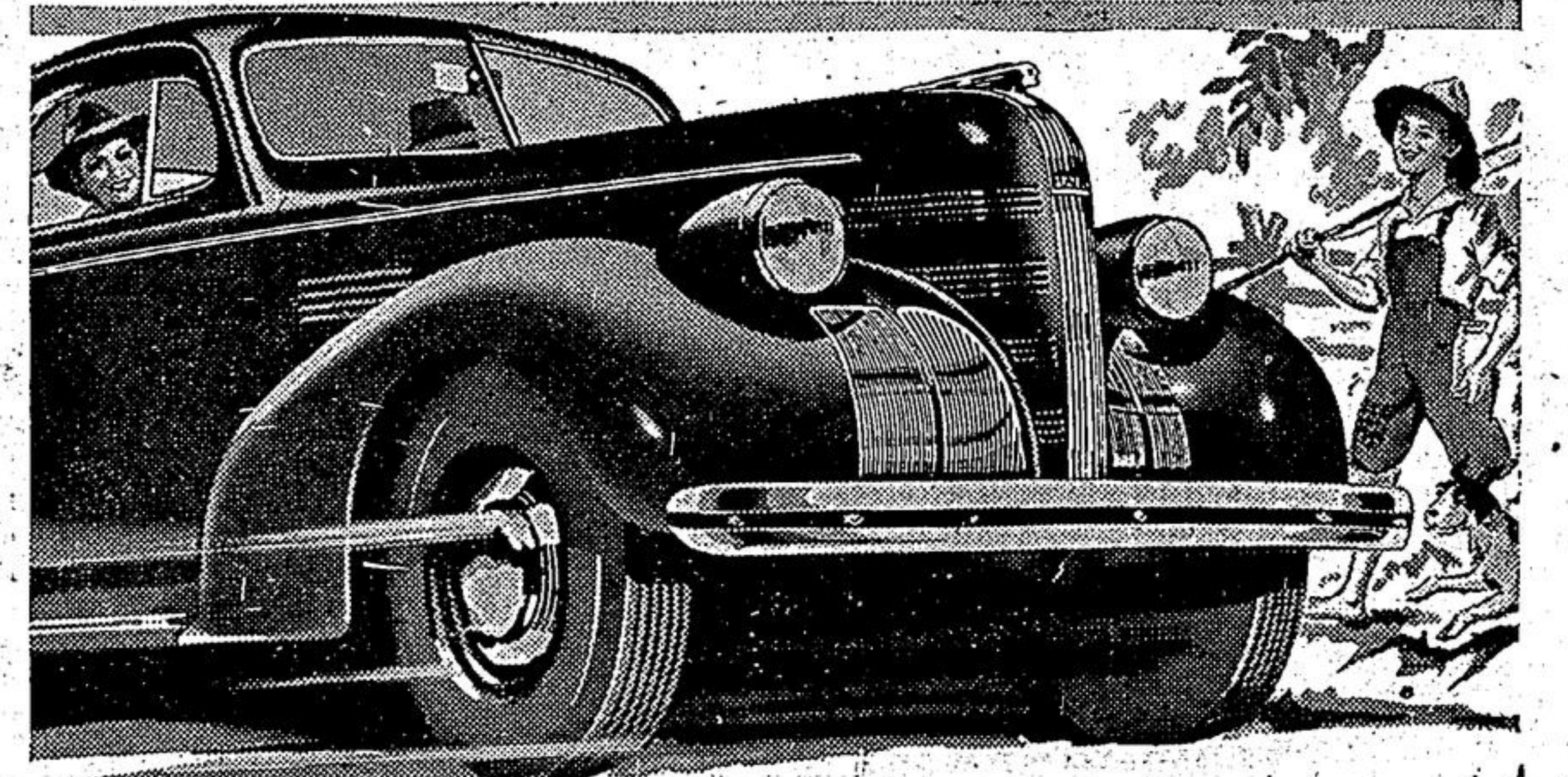
