

Ordained to the Congregational ministry in 1898, Dr. Rollins was called to Blackstone Mass., later being pastor of churches at Wilmington, Del., and Waterloo, Iowa. He was president of Fairmount College, Wichita, Kan., now Municipal University of Wichita, for eight years, taking over the direction of the Congregational Churches in New York State in 1922.
