Mrs. C. Neadler visited her sister in Bowmanville on Sunday.

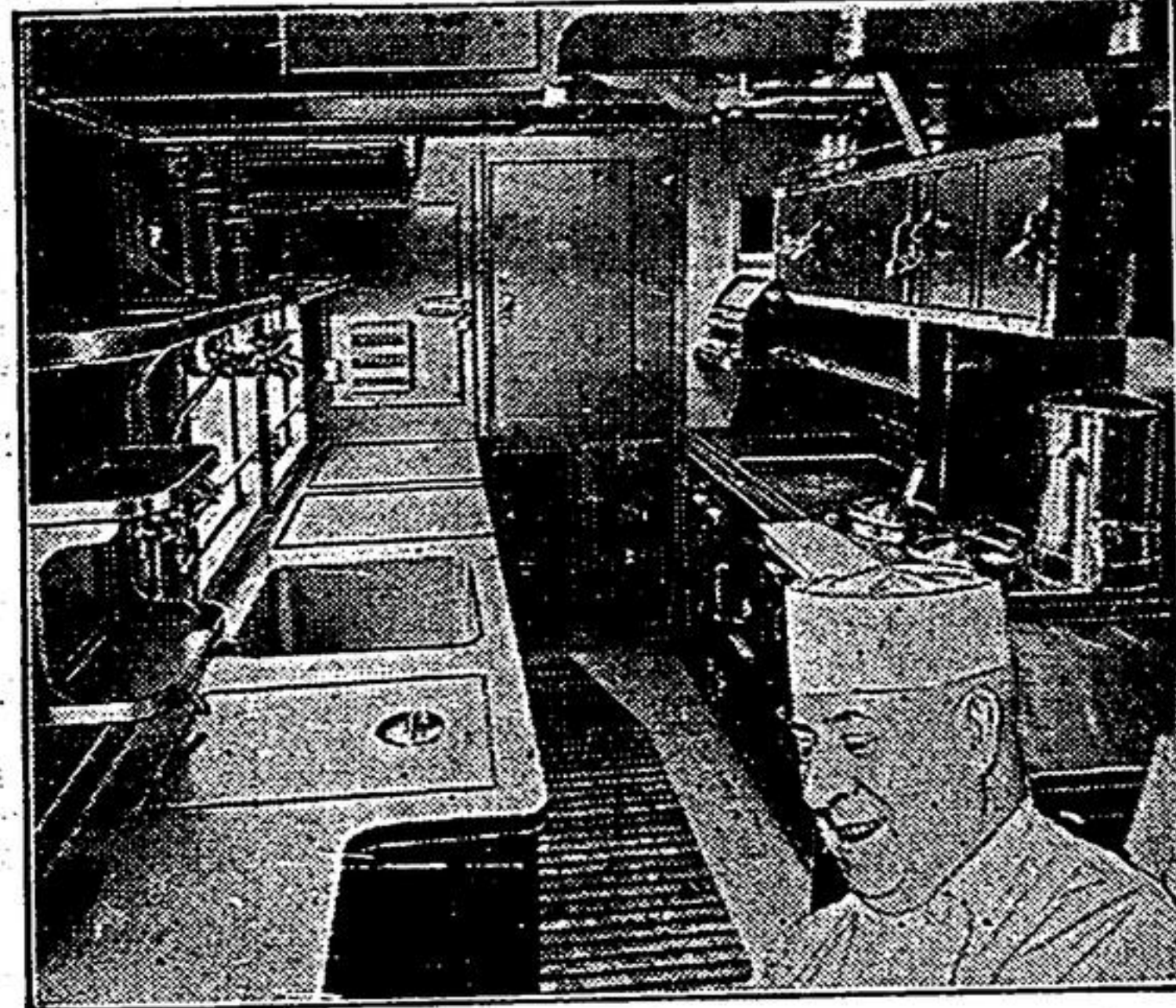

On Sunday morning he preached at the Ridgewood Congregational Church, spent the day with his family and had a heart attack at nine and was dead in an hour.

Funeral services were held at 3 p.m. Wednesday afternoon, at Ridgeview Avenue Congregational Church in White Plains. Rev. F. E. Hyde former pastor at Stouffville was among the many ministers to attend the funeral.

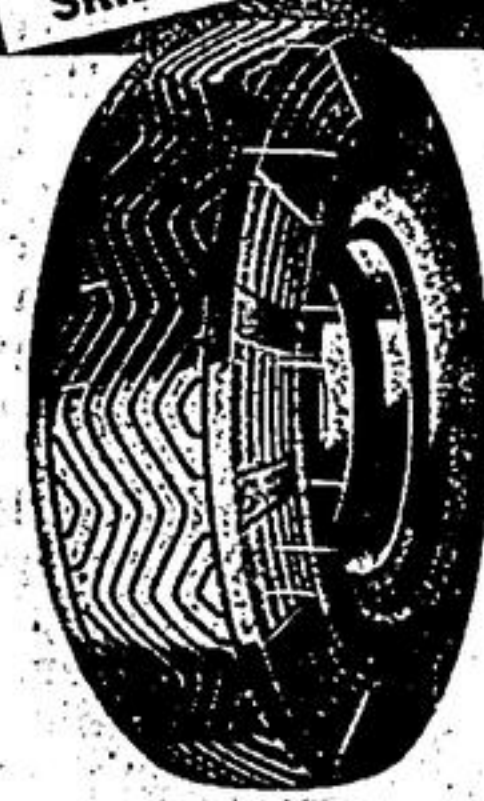
