## ANNA STAPLETON LAID TO REST

The sudden passing of one of this community's most loved and respected citizens in the person of Miss Anna Stapleton occurred at her late home in Bloomington, Tuesday evening, May 2nd.

The youngest daughter of the late Robert and Rebecca Stapleton, she was born June 20th, 1859, on the old homestead "Stone Jug" farm, ninth con-



cession, Whitchurch, which her great nephew, Mr. Eugene Lemon now owns.

After her parents demise she and her brother carried on until through ill health they retired about forty-two years ago to live with their sister Mrs. Jemima Patterson in Bloomington when after her death they lived in Stouffville with their brother David and wife.

A year ago last August her brother John passed away and within two months, David, her last remaining brother of a family of nine brothers and sisters was taken.

Since this double grief occurred her home has been with her niece and husband, Mr. and Mrs. Jos. D. Winterstein, Bloomington, where in spite of much asthmatic distress which she has endured with great Christian fortitude since young womanhood, has much appreciated the fellowship of relatives and friends, and in her stronger periods of health enjoyed short trips, drinking in the beauties of nature and visit with friends.

Only last fall she managed to take a trip to Burlington to visit her niece Mrs. (Rev.) James Chapman, and then to Niagara Falls, and this pleasure was reflected upon when shut in during the cold winter months.

Much of her time during these months, though mostly confined to her bed, was spent in reading and giving out choice bits to those caring for her.

She was converted at an early age under the influence of Elder Tatton's evangelistic preaching and later baptized.

It can be truly said of her "for me to live is Christ and to die is gain" for hers was a life of service for the Master she so much loved, ever Jesus Christ.

Her fine Christian character has influenced many young people through her work in Sunday School teaching over a period of forty years, and also in Christian Endeavour work, in which she had a keen interest, and not a few testify to the determining influence she had upon them for Christian service.

The subject of this sketch had a remarkably clear memory and

revelled in choice literature which she stored up in the years and constantly gave out fitting contributions to all with whom she conversed.

She leaves to mourn her loss many nieces and nephews and their children who rise up to call her blessed.

The funeral on Friday, May 5th, from her late home to public service in the Bloomington Christian Church was taken by her two pastors, Rev. E. Morton and Mr. S. H. Cockburn, who both made impressive remarks from text Romans 5: 1, 2. Many friends gathered to pay their respects to one they loved.

Two favorite hymns were Sung, "Face to Face" and "Abide with me." A request number, "The Sands of Time are Sinking" was rendered as a solo by Mrs. Garfield-Kellington very fittingly.

The organ music was played by Miss Nora Stapleton last remaining member of this branch to bear the family name, and whose services in this capacity was by special request and much appreciated. Pall bearers were great nephews of the deceased being Messrs. Eugene Lemon, Melvin Burnett, Howard Snowball, Murray Hobson, Reginald Winterstein, Clarence Vanzant.

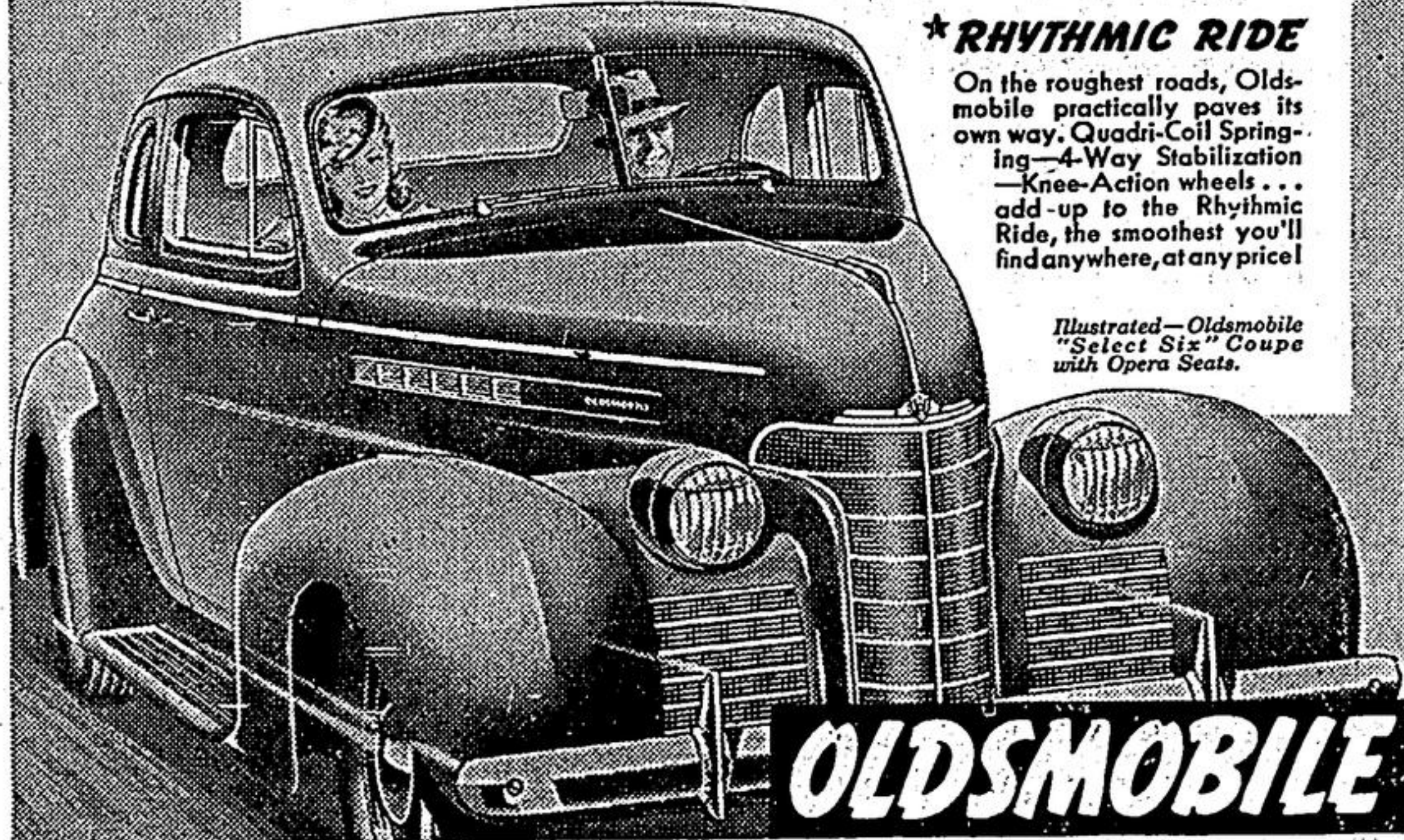
