The Y.P.U. will hold their annual meeting at the home of Mr. and Mrs. A. Yake on Friday evening. There will be election of officers at this meeting.

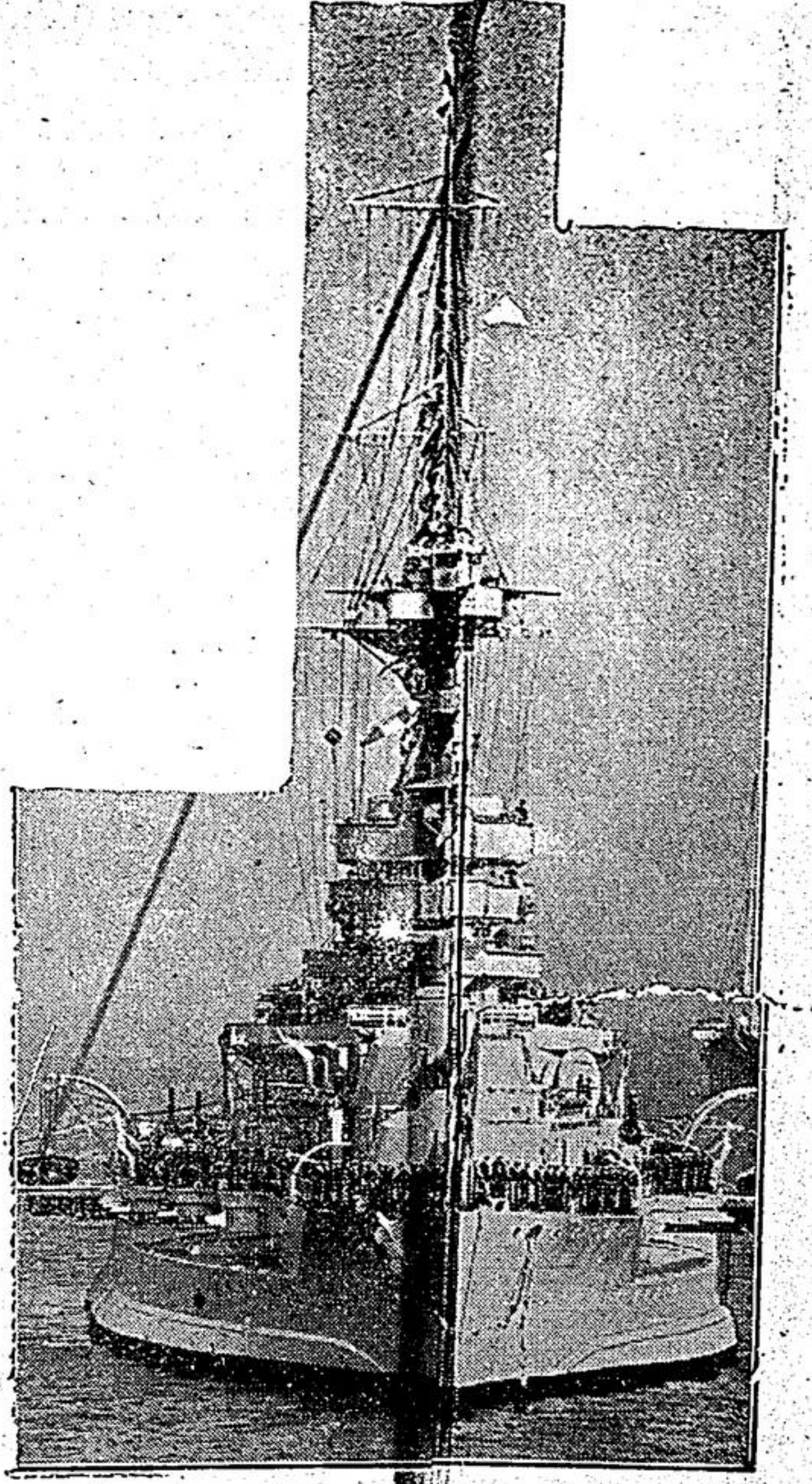

Despatches from Britain last week reported a battleship of the Queen Elizabeth class had been attacked by a submarine. The Queen Elizabeth class battleships were commissioned during the first great war. The Queen Elizabeth, privileged while in England to visit the fleet then in Torbay and the Barham and Malharbour.
