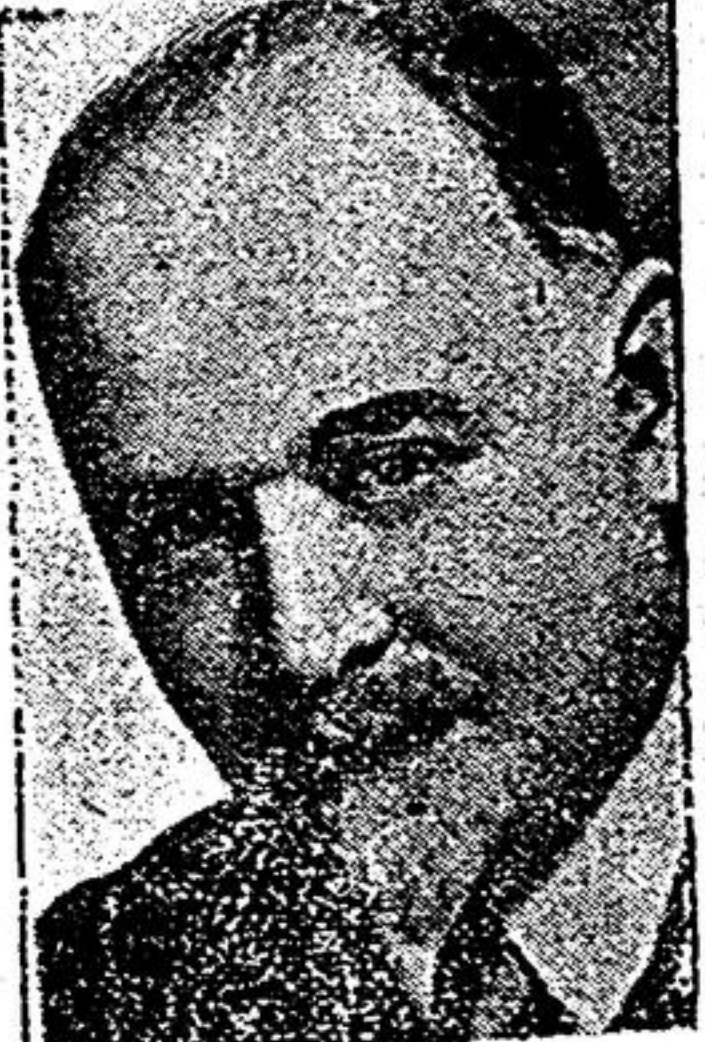

Predicts Hitler's Defeat

To grab the spotlight again as a great national hero, Adolf Hitler, who suffers both from delusions of grandeur and split personality, will try to put himself at the head of a suicide army of 1,000,000 men next summer in a frenzied attack upon the Allies. This theory was advanced in New York recently by Dr. David Seabury. Dr. Seabury believes that "the very frenzy of such a drive will result in its defeat and bring about Hitler's death." This is not the first prediction the well-known psychologist has ventured on the moves of Hitler will make. In October, 1938, he forecast the alliance between Hitler and Stalin, because of the German chancellor's split personality.

Canadian soldiers accidentally fired a tear gas bomb at Oliver Stanley, war secretary, and their own staff officer, during an inspection of the Canadian troops. A unit of the Canadian expeditionary force was being trained in the construction of trenches under a gas attack. The officer in command, not noticing the arrival of the war secretary, fired off a tear gas bomb. Stanley was not carrying a gas mask. The war secretary and his escort were caught in the gas.

Bert Coxen of Montreal was one of four Canadians among the 76 survivors of the torpedoed C.P.R. freighter, Beaverburn, who were landed at an English port, Feb. 8. He was most anxious that "the missus should know I'm fine." Most of the survivors were in overalls. Names of the three other Canadian survivors were given, but there was no mention of Fourth Officer Peter S. Berna of Montreal. However, it was officially announced the only man missing was an English cook.
