Sunday School Lesson

Lesson For April 21

MICAH'S VISION OF PEACE

Golden Text—"And they shall beat their swords into ploughshares, and their spears into pruning-hooks: nations shall not lift up a sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more."

—Micah 4:3

The Lesson as a Whole To Micah, as to all the seers of the old testament, the era of universal peace was still in the future and was linked up with the coming and reign of the Branch of Jehovah (Isa. 4:2), who was destined to be born in Bethlehem (Mic. 5:2), but would be rejected when he came the first time and presented himself as the appointed ruler in Israel. Because of this, the earthly people were to pass through a long period of affliction, which will come to an end only when the promised Redeemer shall appear the second time to bring in the long-predicted Kingdom of peace founded upon righteousness. Thus far, everything has moved along in exact accord with the sure word of prophecy, and we may be certain that the vision of

a warless world and of Christ's righteous reign is not a mere idle dream, but is as certain of fulfillment as the predictions of judgment which have been carried out to the letter through the long centuries of Israel's dispersion and some of which are even now taking place before our own eyes.

Until our Lord's return there can never be settled peace among the nations in spite of all man's best and well-meant efforts, for he has declared that until the end of this age there will be wars and rumors of wars, nation rising against nation and kingdom against kingdom (Matt. 24:6, 7). In Ezekiel 21:27 God says, "I will overturn, overturn it: and it shall be no more, until he come whose right it is: and I will give it him." This refers, as the context shows, to the first dominion which God has promised to Israel as his representative people on the earth. The Jew's, therefore, the key to the prophetic plan. Till the covenant people are restored to God and their land; confusion will prevail among the nations.

Verse by Verse

Mic 4:1—"In the last days." This is a prophetic formula that refers to the climax of God's dealings with Israel and the earth when Messiah's Kingdom will be set up in the world. "The mountain of the house of the Lord" is the kingdom itself, which will bear rule over all the earth. All nations shall acknowledge the sovereignty of our God and his Christ (1 Tim. 6:15).

Verse 2—"The law shall go forth of Zion, and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem." It is a mistake to spiritualize these names. Zion and Jerusalem are to be taken literally. When Jesus reigns as king on Mount Zion, he will rule the nations in righteousness (Psa. 2:4-9). Then men will "go up to the mountain of the Lord" to worship at his call.

Verse 3—"They shall beat their swords into ploughshares, and their spears into pruning-hooks." In that day nations will not need to defend themselves against other powers. That which is now characteristic (Joel 3:10) will be exactly reversed. When Satan is bound (Rev. 20:1-3) and God's Kingdom is set up in power, men shall learn war no more.

Verse 4—"None shall make them afraid." Poverty will be banished in that glorious time, when each one shall possess his own home and no one will tyrannize over another or seek to deprive his neighbor of his inheritance. "The mouth of the Lord of hosts hath spoken it" and we may be certain his Word will be fulfilled and all the earth be subject to Christ's benevolent, yet righteous sway.

Verse 5—"We will walk in the name of the Lord our God for ever and ever." In times past, and even at the present time, the nations serve their own gods and follow their own ambitions, but in that day all will know the Lord (Jer. 31:34) and will walk in obedience to his holy will.

Chap. 5:2—"Bethlehem Ephrath." The exact place where Christ was born was foretold seven centuries before the incarnation. From that city he came who is destined "to be ruler in Israel." This has not yet been fulfilled, but it is as certain to take place as that he was born as indicated. That he is God and man in one person is made clear when we are told that his "goings forth have been from of old, from everlasting." The babe of Bethlehem was Immanuel—God with us. (Isa. 7:14.)

Verse 3—"He will give them up, until the time that she which travaileth hath brought forth." Rejected when he came in lowly grace, he has returned to Heaven, and the earthly people have been dispersed among the Gentiles. But after the time of Jacob's trouble (Jer. 30:7), as a result of their travail of soul, they will recognize in the One their fathers rejected, God's anointed King.

Verse 4—"He shall stand and feed in the strength of the Lord." The ideal king is the shepherd of the flock. Jesus is the Shepherd of Israel (Psa. 80:1), who will tenderly care for the sheep and lambs (Isa. 40:11). Everywhere men will learn to put their trust in him and he shall "be great unto the ends of the earth." His will be a universal kingdom.

Verse 5—"This man shall be the peace." His presence and power will bring all strife to an end. He himself will be the peace of the world. Today all who trust him can say, "He is our peace" (Eph. 2:14). In that day, all mankind will recognize him as the Prince of Peace The Heart of the Lesson

War is the result of the distrust and jealousies that prevail among the nations and all of these are but expressions of the sinfulness of men's hearts. Until all this is curbed, there can be no lasting peace for mankind. Men may try to bring about universal peace by treaties and covenants, but as long as sin rules in their hearts their efforts will only end in disappointment and heart-rending strife. Only when the Lord Jesus Christ asserts his power, at his second coming, will the kingdoms of this world become the Kingdom of our Lord and his Christ

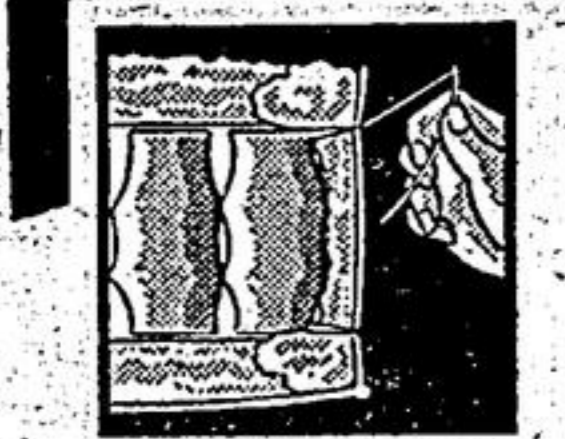

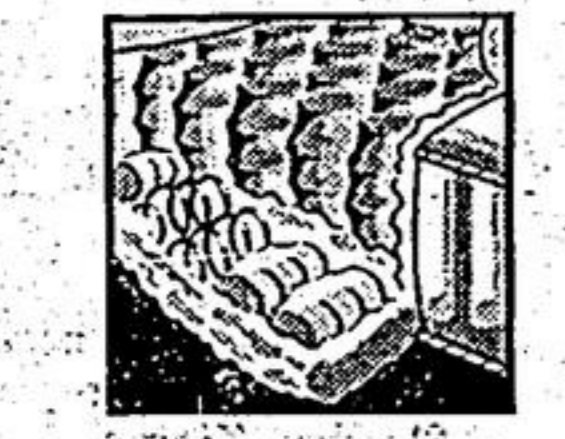

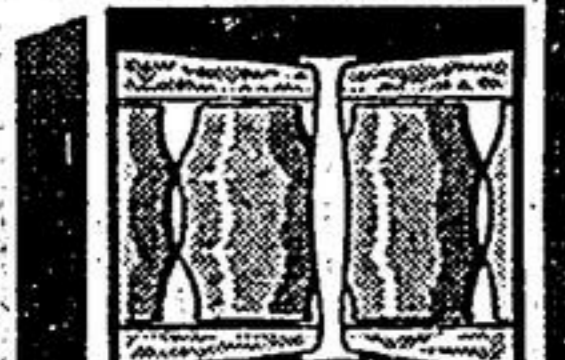
