WELCOMED TO COUNCIL CHAMBERS AGAIN

After a critical illness and surgical operation Councillor Herman Kidd was welcomed by his colleagues at the council meeting again last Saturday by Reeve C. E. Toole of Whitchurch. Mr. Kidd was looking quite fit as he took his accustomed seat.

The council authorized the treasurer to pay the two constables Windsor and Williamson, \$25 with which to fit themselves with new uniforms this summer, while Fred Holidge was paid \$110 for 20 cords of wood to be used for belief purposes. Ross Hood received \$8 for plowing up four acres of corn stubble at lot 19, con. 8, on order of the corn borer inspector, W. Fountain.

Owing to the meeting being held a week earlier than usual, road accounts were not dealt with but will be passed at a special meeting to be called about the middle of the month. The clerk was instructed to call for tenders this week for removing garbage at the two lakes in the township. The cost of this service is born directly by the cottagers affected.
