Prefers Jail to \$100 Fine in Beer Case

"This seems to be quite a place. This is the third time in three weeks that we have had to come before the court, and in each case it is different people in different circumstances, but all appearing for the same type of offense." Magistrate Ebbs declared Uxbridge court Monday, when Laverne Simpson, Uxbridge Township, pleaded guilty to a charge of having liquor in an illegal place.

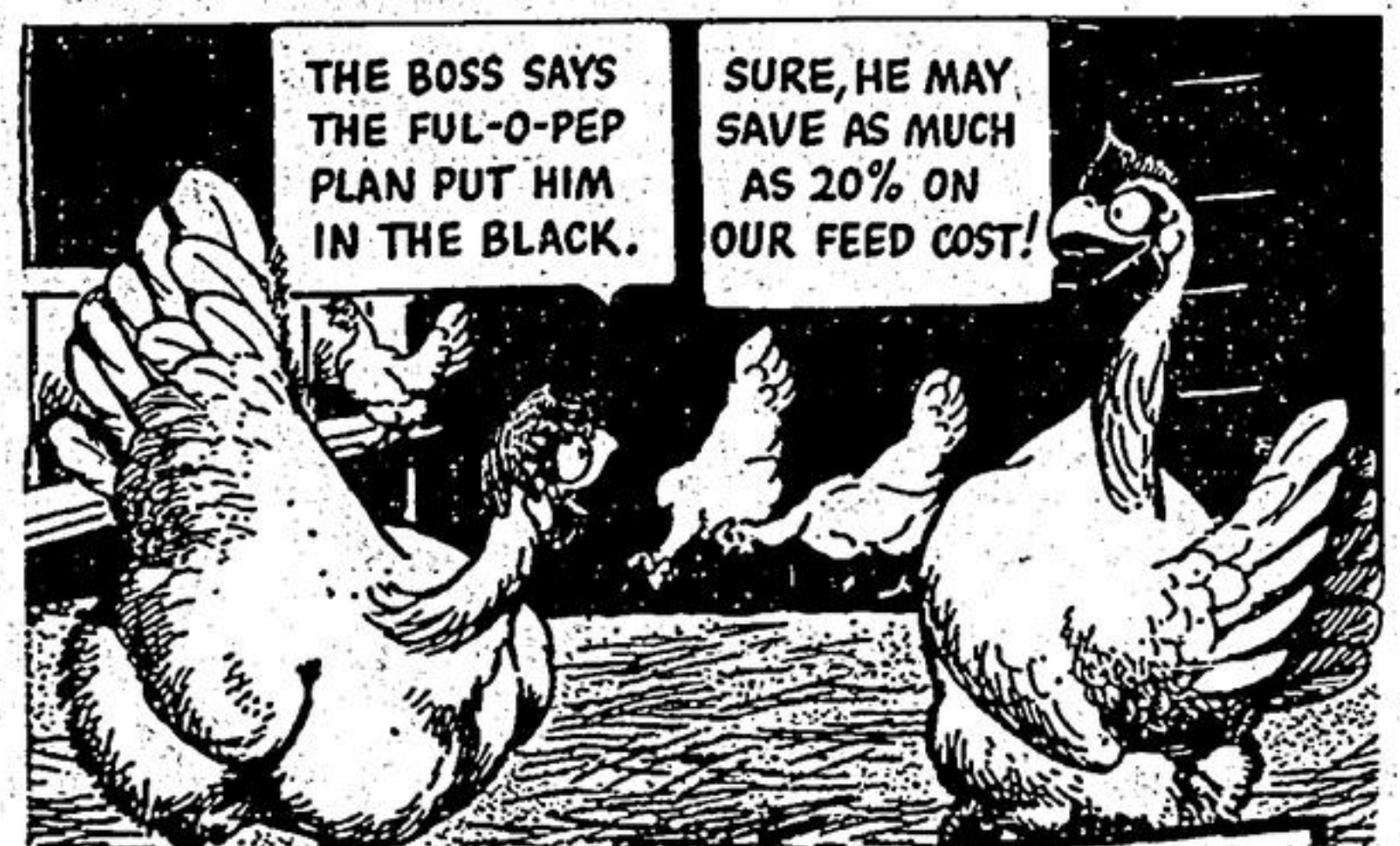
Simpson was arrested by P. O. James Sutherland, Whiteby, at a house near Claremont last Saturday night. Accused was entering the house with a case of beer, and the house had previously been declared a public place.

"He was taking in a case of beer. He said it was his birthday and they were doing a little bit of celebrating," Sutherland told the court.

Crown Attorney Allin F. Annis pointed out that accused had been involved before in similar situations "This is the man who has something to do with the resort called 'The Happy Hunting Grounds' up that way," he said. "When he is arrested his mother owns the property, and when his mother is caught he is the owner."

He was given the option of paying \$100 and costs or one month. He took the jail term.
