Patriotic Concert Well Received

An enthusiastic audience, which filled Ratcliff's Hall last Friday, enjoyed "Challenge of Empire," the patriotic concert, presented by the Canadian Girls in Training and the Junior Band. After the opening choruses, F. L. Button, K.C., president of Stouffville Red Cross, spoke on the work of our local branch.
In the programme which followed, a group of senior girls, in a series of short scenes, provided by their conversation, the links which explained the intervening historical dramas, tableaux and recitations. The theme was based on the story of Drake's Drum, which it was said would roll out whenever England was meeting a crisis.
Drake appeared in person, with his friends, Frobisher and Howard, in the historic bowing scene. Then there followed Nelson at Trafalgar, Wolfe at Quebec, and Laura Secord, prior to her 20 mile trek through the bush to warn the soldiers at Beaver Dams.
One of the most impressive scenes was the Battlefield of 1918, when three boys in uniform repeated, "In Flanders Fields."
Even now, Drake's Drum may be heard, as was shown in the London Music Hall scene. Representing the present type of programme in Britain, the cast included the band, a master of ceremonies, a comedian, and four couples dressed in costumes of various periods. Following an air alarm, the scene shifted to an air raid shelter. England is now, as in the days of old, facing her crisis with courage and determination.
Numerous songs, band numbers, dances and a colourful drill added variety to the show. A fitting background of flags and bunting was arranged by Mr. G. Saunders.
At the request of numerous citizens and with the approval of the Red Cross, this evening of enjoyment will be repeated on Friday, November 15.
