and carried shotguns. Everett Harper, Markham game warden; N. E. H. Sitwell, provincial game warden, and Cecil Clapp of Skinner's Sport club, Toronto, were in charge of the hunt.

The men began combing the township for foxes at the Markham-Scarboro boundary and worked north between the 9th and 10th concessions. The mode of operations was for the hunters to surround a concession lot. Those on the south end would then walk north, theoretically driving all the foxes in front of them to be killed by hunters posted on the other three sides.

The foxes, however, refused to co-operate. If there were numbers of foxes in the district they had other things to do when the men with shotguns called around. Some hunters remarked they enjoyed the clean, invigorating air, but thought the hunting was terrible.

Ten dogs brought along were not loosed on the foxes, except toward the end of the hunt, when they were released to raise a fox believed to be wounded. The dogs could not find any foxes at home, either.
