The Jr. Institute will hold a quilting next Wednesday, April 9th, at the home of Mrs. Donald Ratcliff.

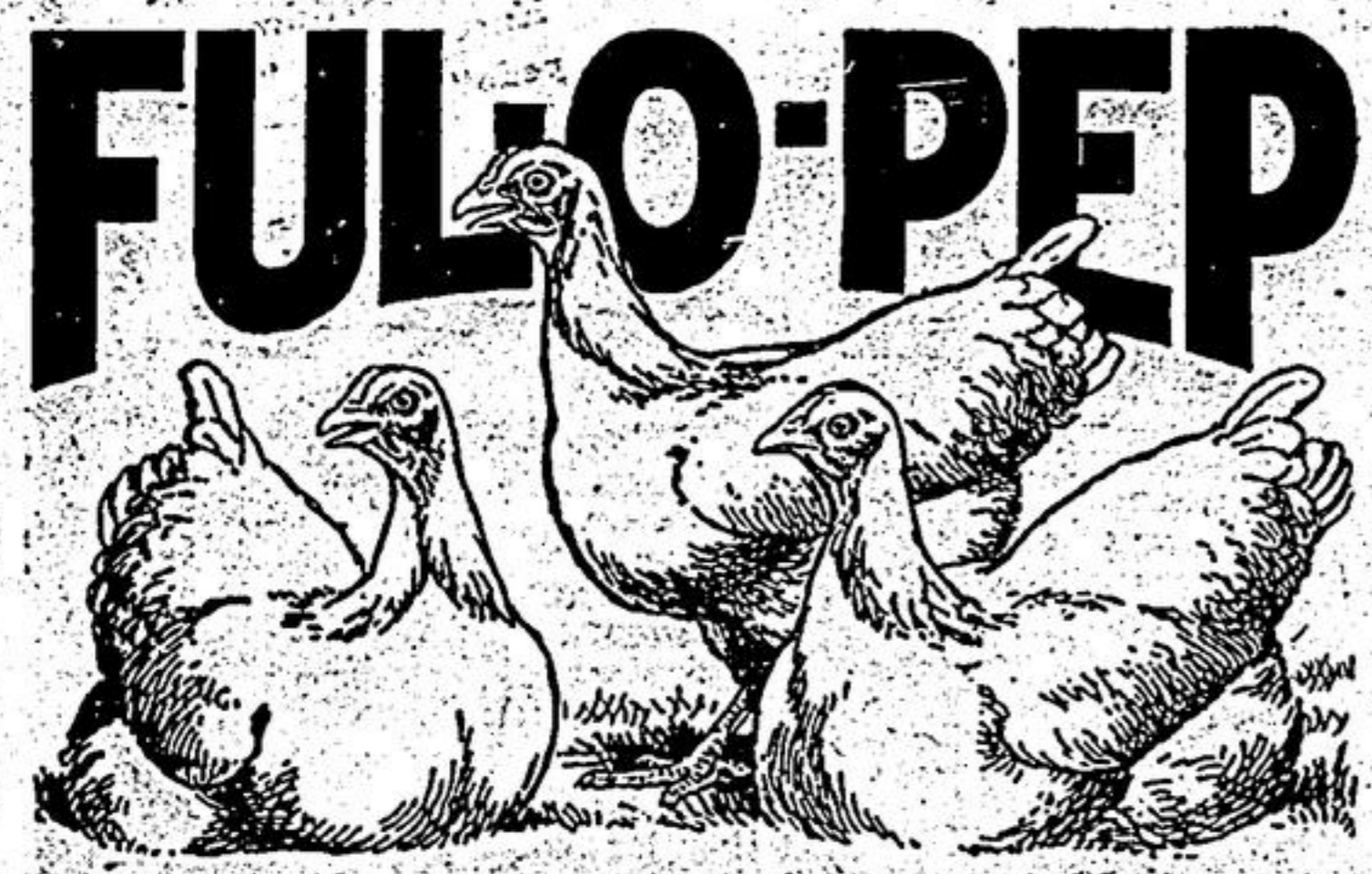
We welcome to our community, Mr. and Mrs. Stuart Burnett who have moved to Gordon Tidbury's farm.
