Township \$20,000 Road Programme Given Dept. O.K.

Whitchurch Township's \$20,000 road program for 1941 has been given the O.K. by the Department of Highways, it was disclosed on Saturday when council was in session at Vandorf for their April meeting. The expenditures is about the same as recent years, and is half paid by the Department.

The members gave a cordial hearing to a deputation from Bloomington district, composed of Sandy Davis, Eugene Baker, Eugene Lemon and Cliff Lemon, who registered a protest against the service given them this winter by the snow plow operated from Ballantrae. "Many farmers are not just satisfied with the manner the roads were looked after," said Sandy Davis road commissioner. Roads were left closed for two weeks, he continued. Members of the deputation suggested that the township might consider buying a truck.

"Did you get satisfactory service before the last big storm," asked the reeve.

"No, we did not," said Mr. Baker. The reeve said he appreciated the call from this deputation, and promised that council would consider their suggestions before another winter comes around. He said the council was anxious to give every part of township equal service, and promised to have banks cut down this summer to provide better winter roads.

Road accounts passed for payment totalled \$1485, mostly for snow removal, repairs, and supplies. The clerk reported that cost of roads to date was fully \$1,000 less than last year at this date.
