## Filled 405 Orders For Western Grain

We have just been advised by the Agricultural Representative, W. M. Cockburn, that a total of 41 cars of feed grain have been brought into the County under the Freight-free Policy of the Dominion and Provincial Departments of Agriculture. This represents a total of 405 orders from various farmers in the County while Stiver Bros. of Stouffville was forced to cancel several orders received too late to be filled. The purchase of this grain was limited to bonified farmers who were engaged in agriculture as a means of livelihood and the policy was brought in to effect to assist those who through unfavorable weather conditions last year, were disappointed in securing their usual supply of feed grain.

Mr. Cockburn would like to issue a word of warning to those farmers securing this grain that under no circumstances should it be used for seed, owing to the fact that in many cases there is quite a mixture of varieties which might or might not be suitable to our conditions and ripen evenly.
