## Local Audience Previews Film, "Pastor Hall"

On Friday afternoon the management of the Stanley Theatre entertained a number of guests to a preview of the picture "Pastor Hall" which is playing here this Thursday Friday and Saturday.

"Pastor Hall" is a British production, based on the story inspired by the life of Pastor Niemoeller. In brief the story is of a pleasant country village in Germany whose Pastor is forced to re-orient his life with the arrival of the Storm Troopers in his little parish. After endeavoring to accept the new order for a time, he finally realizes that he can no longer retain his self-respect or carry on the work for which he was ordained without condemning the Nazi creed. He speaks up, is arrested and sent to a concentration camp. The scenes in this camp are terrifying. Through the assistance of friends he escapes from the camp, but instead of permitting his rescuers to spirit him out of the country he decides to go back to his church and give one last sermon, knowing that his appearance there can only be followed by his death at the hands of the Storm Troopers.

This paper urges everyone possible to see this picture. This is not propaganda, and it presents the Nazi point of view quite eloquently through the mouth of the Storm Troop leader. Nevertheless it will leave you with an uncomfortable sense that sinister and evil power is at large which must at all costs be exterminated.

## VILLAGE OF STOUFFVILLE THE PUBLIC HEALTH

NOTICE is hereby given that all residents of Stouffville are required to forthwith clean their cellars, drains, yards, pig styes, water closets, out-buildings and remove therefrom all dirt, manure, and any other substance which may endanger the public health and have the same completed by the 15th day of May next on which day the Sanitary Inspector will commence a general inspection and furthermore take notice that the section of the Public Health Act prohibiting the keeping of hogs excepting in pens at least 100 feet away from any dwelling house and lane and street with floors kept clean from all standing water and regularly cleansed, will be strictly enforced.

All citizens are requested to keep their property constantly clean and thoroughly disinfected.

When the amount of a tender exceeds the sum of \$5,000.00—whether it be for one building only or more—the tenders must attach to their tender a certified cheque on a chartered bank in Canada, made payable to the order of the Honourable the Minister of Public Works, equal to 10 per cent of the amount of the tender, or Bearer Bonds of the Dominion of Canada or of the Canadian National Railway Company and its constituent companies unconditionally guaranteed as to principal and interest by the Dominion of Canada, or the aforementioned bonds and a certified cheque, if required to make up an odd amount.

The Department also reserves the right to demand from any successful tenderer a security deposit, in the form of a certified cheque or bond as above, equal to 10 per cent of the amount of his bid, to guarantee the proper fulfilment of the contract.
