## UNAUTHORIZED SNOW SHOVELLING WILL NOT BE PAID FOR

Unless under special orders from the Road Superintendent farmers will not be paid for shovelling snow in Uxbridge Township this winter. Since the council purchased a heavy duty plowing outfit, they do not propose to allow farmers to submit bills for work done without special authority. This decision was arrived at on Monday at Goodwood, and motion by Councillors Beach and Rae confirmed the stand taken.

Principal part of Monday's business was the passing of accounts, totalling \$2,236.64. Large items were \$450 for an arch abutment, culvert and labor installing, and \$1,000 as payment on snow plow. Reeve Ashenurst presided and all councillors were present.

## May Hear Treas. Statement

Although no election can be held in Markham Township on January 1st the ratepayers are to receive the annual treasurer's report just as they will receive it in those townships where the council comes up for election or acclamation annually instead of every two years.

We doubt very much that there will be any ratepayers at the township hall on nomination day, as with no possibility of any election, the incentive to hold a public meeting is gone. The treasurer of the township will publish his financial report in the accustomed form, and any ratepayer who would like a copy is entitled to one. These are usually handed out at the public meeting that follows the nomination, but one can be obtained any time after December 29th, at the office of the treasurer.

It should be pointed out that the ratepayers could hold a public meeting on nomination day to discuss the year's business, but as is stated, with council not being "put on the spot" there would not be the same incentive to discuss issues. Consequently the customary meeting that follows all nominations is likely to fade away.

In Pickering, Uxbridge and Whitchurch townships, nominations will be held on December 29 at the usual hours, and elections, if any, will be held on January 5.

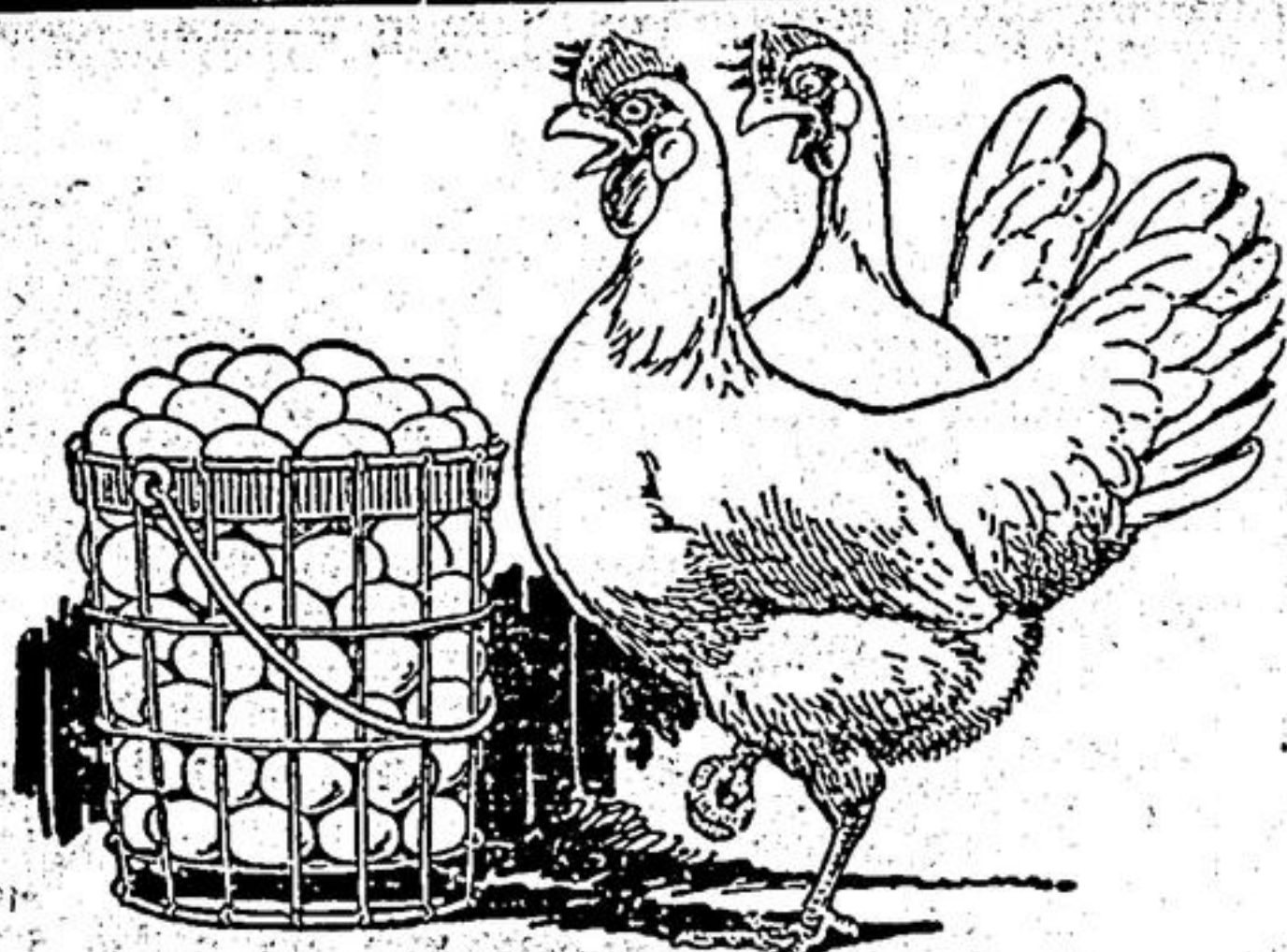
